Smithy formed a partnership with Charles Ulm, who had also served in the war and shared Smithy's enthusiasm for a transpacific flight. Smithy bought a three-engined plane in the United States called a 'Fokker'that could fit four people, which he called the Southern Cross. He and Ulm hired two Americans, Harry Lyon and James Warner, to navigate and work the radio on the Southern Cross.
