## Provisional use of Austrian Stamps 1 May 1867-30 June 1867



2974 Braila (Ibraila) 1867: Unpaid entire letter from Ibraila to Lyon, France via Strasbourg struck with "JBRAILA" circular datestamp (May 3) in brownish black (Tchilinghirian fig. 730) and thus the third day of this P.O. operating under the auspices of the Hungarian P.O. - with 'A.' (Austria) in black and charged with '10' décimes due mark upon receipt (May 11). Rare.
Bucharest 1864: Arms 5 s. rose and 10 s. blue, perf. $91 / 2$, used on 1867 entire letter from Bucharest to Constantinople tied by "BUCAREST" circular datestamps (May 7) in black (Tchilinghirian fig. 714). Reverse with Austrian P.O. "Constantinopel" arrival cds (May 10) in black. A rare entire and a very early first week usage from the Hungarian Post Office.

Galatz 1864: Arms 10 s. blue, perf. $9^{1 / 2}$, two single examples and a vertical pair used on 1867 cover from Galatz to Montpellier, France via Strasbourg endorsed "via Vienne and Paris"; the adhesives initially cancelled by pen crosses (2) and the pair with manuscript "Galatz 14/5" cancellation in ink. Cancelled again in transit in Vienna with circular "1" obliterators in black. Reverse with Montpellier arrival (May 21). Slight acid ink fault on obverse but a magnificent and early usage. Rare and believed unique. Signed Ferchenbauer.

A scarce usage - the new 1867 "soldi" issue did not arrive at the Romanian Post Offices until July 1867.
Braila (Ibraila) 1864: Arms 10 s . blue, perf. $91 / 2$, a used example crossed by file fold on obverse of 1867 registered cover to Constantinople tied by "JBRAILA" circular datestamp (June 27) in black (Tchilinghirian fig. 730), with "RACCOM." registration handstamp above and docket number '165' and " $R R^{\prime \prime}$ (Return Receipt) in manuscript. The " $R R$ " was a further charge of 10 soldi with an adhesive applied to the registration receipt. Reverse with half of 10 s. blue applied for registration and Lloyd Agency in Constantinople (June 30) arrival cds.

A rarity. Cert. Glatz AIEP (2015).



1867: 5 s. red, a used horizontal pair on cover front to Würzburg, Bavaria tied by "BUCAREST" circular datestamp (July 13) in black (Tchilinghirian fig. 714). A very scarce usage, carried under the GAPU rate of 10 soldi for a single letter. Rare thus. Signed Ferchenbauer. 1867: 10 s. blue, a used example on 1867 entire letter to Vienna endorsed "Franco" at base, neatly tied by "BUCAREST" circular datestamp (Sept 13) in black (Tchilinghirian fig. 714). Reverse with sender's wafer label (Rissdorfer's pharmacy) in blue and Vienna arrivals (Sept 18 ) in black. Minor wrinkles to entire but very attractive.

1867: 3 s. green, 10 s. blue (on reverse) and 15 s. brown, all used on 1867 single rate registered cover to Genova, Italy tied by "BUKAREST / RECOMMANDIRT" oval datestamps (Oct 10) in black (Tchilinghirian fig. 716). Venezia transit cds (Oct 16), Venezia-Firenze cds and Genova (Oct 17) arrival alongside; readdressed to San Luca d'Attaro. Opens well for Exhibit display, a fine and scarce cover.
Note: 18 soldi was the Lloyd sea route rate for under 15 grams, however this cover went via the Continental route.

Whilst the postage was free due to the nobility of the addressee, the registration fee of 10 soldi still had to be pair. Reverse with the requisite five red wax seals and arrival cds (Oct 21) in black. Believed unique, a very rare usage.

2989 1867: 10 s. blue, two used examples on 1867 single rate cover to Palermo, Sicily tied by "BUCAREST" circular datestamp (Nov 3) in black (Tchilinghirian fig. 714). Red "P.D." below and reverse with Vienna cds (Nov 8), Venice cds, Naples cds (Nov 11) and Palermo arrival (Nov 12) all in black. A fresh and fine cover.

A rare cover - the single rate to Switzerland had been reduced to 15 soldi on 1 September 1868 and thus this double rate cover was overpaid 10 soldi. Slight peripheral aging and the 10 s . with contemporary tear but a scarce and most attractive cover. Signed Ferchenbauer.

Reverse with small part of flap missing and Austrian P.O. Constantinople transit cds (Nov 11) and "Trebisonda" Austrian P.O. (Nov 18) in black. A scarce cover.

3002 1868: Unpaid entire letter to Vienna cancelled by "BUCAREST" cds (Nov 16) in black (Tchilinghirian fig. 715). Reverse with Alsergrund / Wien arrival cds (Nov 21) in black and charged ' $15^{\prime}$ Kreuzer to pay in manuscript. Opens well for display, scarce.

A rare cover - the rate to Switzerland had been reduced to 15 soldi on 1 September 1868 . Slight peripheral aging reduced but a scarce and attractive cover.
