They are all from Plate III, but on a careful study of the indiividual positions and the relevant flaws show that the Proofs were printed after the issue of the adhesives concerned. Furthermoere, the figures of value have not been plugged into the plate as utilised on Plate III but inserted afterwards during a second printing.
