NEW SOUTH WALES

- 1788 A fleet of 11 ships with convicts, soldiers and others arrived at Botany Bay in January 1788. Captain Phillip proclaimed the new colony. The first settlement was made at Sydney. The area was known as New South Wales with Sydney as the administrative centre and included all territory east of longitude 135* East.
- The Sydney Gazette of 10 July 1803 first mentions Postal services.
- ,Act to Regulate the Postage of Letters in New South Wales' under Governor Sir Thomas Brisbane.
- ,Act to Provide for the Conveyance and Postage of Letters' under Governor Sir Richard Bourke introduced letter charges according to weight and distance carried.

A cheap local Sydney Post is established by the issue of prepaid embossed stamped envelopes.


- 1848/49 Proposals for a uniform rate of postage followed by the ,Act to Establish a Uniform Rate of Postage and to consolidate and Amend the Law for the Conveyance and Postage of Letters' which took effect from 1 January 1850. The Act authorised the issue of adhesive postage stamps.
- The first stamps ,The Sydney Views' were issued. They were engraved locally on copper plates. The 1d. by Robert Clayton, the 2d. by John Carmichael and the 3d. by H.C. Jervis. All three copper printing plates wore rapidly and were variously re-engraved by H.C. Jervis.
- The second locally produced ,Laureated' issue, engraved by John Carmichael and H.C.Jervis on steel plates (1d., 2d.plate I, 3d.) and on copper plates (2d. plate II, 6d.,8d.)
- 1852 Stamps to prepay postage made obligatory.
- The third ,Diadem' issue made from engraved steel plates made by Perkins, Bacon in London.
- , Laureated' Sixpence Registeration Stamp.
- From New issues printed from typographed plates printed by De La Rue in
- **1862** London.
- 1879 First appearance of O.S. overprinted Official Stamps



30001 1819 (April 3): Entire letter from one Frederick Drennan in Sydney via England to Capt. de Reynaud of the 60th Regiment at the Cape of Good Hope, endorsed 'fav.d by J. Pincham Esq.' and 'Messrs. Greenwood & Co.', struck in transit with fine step type "HASTINGS / SHIP LETTER" in brown (Robertson S3) with London cds (Oct 19) in red on reverse and rated '1/4d.' due to pay upon arrival (8d. Ship Letter + 8d. for under 80 miles). The letter presumably forwarded on to the Cape as an enclosure by Greenwood & Co. A fine and rare

Note: The writer, Frederick Drennan, entered the Army as Assistanmt Commisary in April 1809, he served in Canada during the American War, later served in Jamaica and then was sent to New South Wales arriving on the 'Globe' in January 1819. He almost immediately fell foul of both Governor Lachlan Macquarie and Lieutenant-Colonel James Erskine, the latter having him arrested and later released. He was sent back to England under arrest in 1822 after the NSW Treasury enquiries found a deficiency of over £ 6'500, which amount he failed to repay. Note: The Australian Agricultural Society was established in 1824 by an Act of Parliamenet and granted 1 million acres to raise fine wool sheep. From 1831 the company was involved in coal mining in the Newcastle region.



1839 (June 21): Entire letter from Bathurst to London struck on despatch with octagonal framed "BATHURST / POST PAID" in red and superb oval "PAID SHIP LETTER / 會 / JE 27 / 1839 / SYDNEY" in red. Reverse with oval framed "GENERAL POST OFFICE / SYDNEY" datestamp (June 27) in black. Framed "INDIA LETTER / BRIGHTON" in red (Robertson In. 2) somewhat overstruck by London arrival cds in red (Nov 18). Rated at '1/-' in manuscript, the entire was carried by the 'Andromache' on June 30, thence via Rio de Janeiro (Sept 21). A fine and attractive entire.

30017 1849: Alfred Clayton 'Sydney View' Essays, composite photo-lithographic facsimile of the original Essay which is housed in the Tapling Collection in the British Library, comprising reproductions of the 1d. and 3d. Essays which are mounted on paper and endorsed "The form and colour are approved, but the execution is very far from satisfactory and must be greatly improved before the contract can be sanctioned". This facsimile was produced by Alfred van Dyck, some time before the originals were sold by him to Tapling and prior to Thomas Tapling's death in 1891. The blank space in between contained the Essay for the 2d. value which was purchased for, and remains in, the Collection of His Majesty King Charles III. We record just one other example of this reproduction (copy with the lot), ex Sir Gawaine Baillie, sold at Sotheby's, Melbourne in July 2005, lot 812, which was not as fine as the example offered here.

On 18 April 1861 Ormond Hill, the nephew of Rowland Hill, wrote to Joshua Butters Bacon the head of Perkins Bacon and Co.:

"My dear Sir, Two or three of my friends who are collectors of Postage Stamps have asked me to procure for them specimens of new or uncommon stamps whenever I have it in my power. It occurs to me that perhaps you may be able to give me a few ...'

He added on 24 April:

"... I should be glad to have six stamps of each kind ...'

On 15 August J. Upham (for J.B. Bacon) sent the stamps to Pearson Hill with the following letter:

"Dear Sir, I beg now to send you as promised ... an envelope addressed to Ormond Hill Esq. containing 6 obliterated impressions of each of the stamps named in the list and request you will take two of each for Rowland Hill Esq. and yourself and then seal the package and forward it together with a letter which you will also find addressed to him, to Mr. Ormond Hill.'

It turned out that the supply of the Crown Agents' property was given

Ormond Hill was not asked to return the "specimens", and in fact, all were treated as private property. Nevertheless, the case destroyed Perkins Bacon as future printers for the Crown Agents.





On 18 April 1861 Ormond Hill, the nephew of Rowland Hill, wrote to Joshua Butters Bacon the head of Perkins Bacon and Co.:

"My dear Sir, Two or three of my friends who are collectors of Postage Stamps have asked me to procure for them specimens of new or uncommon stamps whenever I have it in my power. It occurs to me that perhaps you may be able to give me a few ..."

He added on 24 April:

"... I should be glad to have six stamps of each kind ..."

On 15 August J. Upham (for J.B. Bacon) sent the stamps to Pearson Hill with the following letter:

"Dear Sir, I beg now to send you as promised ... an envelope addressed to Ormond Hill Esq. containing 6 obliterated impressions of each of the stamps named in the list and request you will take two of each for Rowland Hill Esq. and yourself and then seal the package and forward it together with a letter which you will also find addressed to him, to Mr. Ormond Hill."

It turned out that the supply of the Crown Agents' property was given without authority.

Ormond Hill was not asked to return the "specimens", and in fact, all were treated as private property. Nevertheless, the case destroyed Perkins Bacon as future printers for the Crown Agents.







On 18 April 1861 Ormond Hill, the nephew of Rowland Hill, wrote to Joshua Butters Bacon the head of Perkins Bacon and Co.:

"My dear Sir, Two or three of my friends who are collectors of Postage Stamps have asked me to procure for them specimens of new or uncommon stamps whenever I have it in my power. It occurs to me that perhaps you may be able to give me a few ..."

He added on 24 April:

"... I should be glad to have six stamps of each kind ..."

On 15 August J. Upham (for J.B. Bacon) sent the stamps to Pearson Hill with the following letter:

"Dear Sir, I beg now to send you as promised ... an envelope addressed to Ormond Hill Esq. containing 6 obliterated impressions of each of the stamps named in the list and request you will take two of each for Rowland Hill Esq. and yourself and then seal the package and forward it together with a letter which you will also find addressed to him, to Mr. Ormond Hill."

It turned out that the supply of the Crown Agents' property was given without authority.

Ormond Hill was not asked to return the "specimens", and in fact, all were treated as private property. Nevertheless, the case destroyed Perkins Bacon as future printers for the Crown Agents.
