

"*Emeu*", which left Sydney on 11 July 1858, via Melbourne (July 16), via King George's Sound (date not known) and thence to Galle (Aug 7), Aden (Aug 18) and Suez (Aug 24). Transferred to the "*Teviot*" at Alexandria vias Malta (Aug 30) to Southampton (Sept 9), with reverse showing London arrival datestamp (Sept 10). Signed on reverse "*Tilted Frame - Frank Chadwick*". An outstanding cover of the utmost rarity.

Note: The cover is addressed to Henry Drummond Wolff (1830-1908) at the Foreign Office in London, where he started as a clerk. He was a Conservative MP for Bournemoth and later Portsmouth, from 1874 until 1885. He was British high commissioner in Egypt from 1885 to 1887 and was later appointed Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to Teheran in 1888, a post he held until 1891, thereafter he was Ambassador to Madrid from 1892 to 1900.

The Inverted Swan One of the World's First Inverted Errors

In 1854, Western Australia issued its first stamps, featuring the colony's symbol, the black swan. While the 1d black was engraved in Great Britain by Perkins Bacon, other values were produced by Horace Samson in Perth using lithography, and with different frames around the swan design for each value.

In January 1855 the additional 4d stamps were needed. When the printing stone was brought out of storage, two of the impressions had been damaged, one was accidentally redone upsidedown. The stone's block of 60 was transferred four times to make the printing stone, and 97 sheets were printed before the mistake was discovered and corrected, resulting in a total of 388 errors being printed. The tilted frame variety occurs four times on the printing stone of 240.

This is one of the world's first invert errors. Technically, it is the frame that is inverted, not the image of the swan, but it has become commonly known as the Inverted Swan. No unused copies are recorded.

The Inverted Swan on offer at Corinphila in November is registered as number VIII in the Encyclopedia of Rare and Famous Stamps (Williams 1993). The provenance goes back to 1913 when M. Kurt Maier bought the stamp in a collection and sold it onward to H.P. Manus. Plumridge in England sold it at auction 7 July 1933 to Richard Roberts, who sold it onward to a continental dealer the same year. Again, the same year it shifted hands to Robert B. Yardley, who kept it eleven years until H.R.Harmer Ltd in London sold it as lot #469 at the fifth Yardley sale in London to Noël Calnan. On 20 October 1964 Robson Lowe auctioned it again as lot #193, and it was sold to a collector in England who kept it until 15 June 1989, when the current owner bought it at Christie's Robson Lowe in New York as Lot #3454 on 15 June 1989.

Of the 13 genuine examples recorded*, only 6 are with collectors - including one extraordinary collection that contains no less than 4 examples (Nos. IV, VII, XI and XII). Thus, just two examples can be possibly "available" on the philatelic market. In November the opportunity arises to buy one of these **TWO** from The Dr Thomas and Richard Debney Collection.

* Previously it was 14 genuine examples recorded, only 7 with collectors. However, following a Stampboards.com thread (2018), one of the 14 was questioned (recorded as #XV) by members of the Western Australia Study Group in Perth and now 13 genuine examples are accepted. In Richard Debney's opinion the radical difference in the "O" of "FOUR" in #XV and the other accepted examples is conclusive.

Williams's work on the world's rarities, 7 of the 13 are in permanent or institutional collections: The collection of His Majesty King Charles III, the Tapling at the British Library, The Duke of Leinster collection at the National Museum of Ireland, The Western Australian Museum in Perth, The White collection at the Mitchell Library in Sydney and two in the Miss Vickery collection in the Powerhouse Museum in Sydney. The remaining six examples (Williams number XV was later found to be a forgery) are with collectors - including one extraordinary collection that contains no less than 4 examples (Nos. IV, VII, XI and XII). Thus as I write, just two examples can be considered to be possibly "available" on the philatelic market. An outstandingly rare stamp and a famous and iconic error. Cert.
