

The Origin of the Large Blocks of Bull's Eyes

Everaldo Santos FRPSL

The Bull's Eyes were, after the Penny Black, the second adhesives to be used for the franking of mail on a countrywide basis. This fact, their design and their printing characteristics placed them as one of the darlings of the philatelic world. Presenting the Brazilian numerals at HAFNIA in 1976, Terfik Kuyas inaugurated a series of FIP Grand Prix for collections displaying the Bull's Eyes.

Since then five other FIP Grand Prix have been awarded to traditional collections featuring this issue:

- Reynaldo Pracchia LONDON 1980
- Angelo Lima PHILEXFRANCE 1989
- Angelo Lima PHILA NIPPON 1991
- Everaldo Santos LONDON STAMPSHOW 2000
- Luis Alemany ISRAEL 2008

All of these collections had large blocks of Bull's Eyes as their highlights. However, none of them, including my own, studied and described properly the usage of those blocks. The description of the items was based exclusively on their number of stamps, their rankings in the roll of the largest known multiples and the postmark.

Until ten years ago, the version given by the most important Brazilian catalogue (*RHM* Page 261) and accepted by the philatelic community was that these stamps were used for fiscal duties and judicial taxes. This was contrary to common knowledge in most Latin American countries, where it is known that these items were used for postal purposes.

In 2003, while casually paging through a lawsuit that condemned a woman for the death of her daughter, I came upon the detailing of the expenses incurred in that lawsuit. The costs of tenure, transit, distribution, lawyers and 180 réis for 'correio' were stated on the last page of the document. To my surprise 180 réis was the sum of the three 60 réis stamps of the 'Slanting Figures' type attached to the first page. When placed on the scale, the complete legal document gave a reading of 160g.

The 1842 decree which regulated the use of the first Brazilian stamps states that:

Article 3 - "Judicial documents when sent overland should pay $\frac{1}{4}$ of a normal letter and $\frac{1}{2}$ if by maritime mail."

Article 4 - "The Actuaries and Secretaries of judgments and courts in which the lawsuits end, should not deliver any part of the documents without seeing proof that the postal rates have been paid."

This meant that the overland postage rate for legal documents weighing 160g should be the same of a letter weighing 40g (10 to 12 octaves) or 180 réis. Great!

I applied the same process to four other complete lawsuits, and the rate/weight ratios were approximately the same but not always exactly as stated in Article 3.

In a separate decree of May 1843, which defined the table of postage rates to be used by the agents, I found that the rates for letters and lawsuits did not conform to Article 3 of the 1842 decree. In the attached table you can see that the rates for letters changed for every quarter-ounce while the rates for lawsuits remained the same for every one-ounce interval. This supersedes the regulation of 1842 and explains the differences I have found in some documents.

Nowadays, several other documents have been found which clearly show in the list of expenses (almost always on the last page) a written postage rate compatible with the weight and the stamps attached to the first pages.

It is now time to abandon any idea that those blocks had non-philatelic purposes. It is worthwhile adding that I have never found any example of a Brazilian numeral showing any indications of it being used for fiscal purposes.

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In other words: the large blocks of Brazilian numerals were used to pay a postal rate and not a fiscal tax.

Other intriguing questions which have been unanswered for decades are: "why were some of the blocks franking judicial documents pen-cancelled?" and "why in some cases did they not show any form of cancellation?"

This is due to the fact that, in most cases, judicial documents were transported by special courier bypassing the post offices. The main reasons were urgency, confidentiality and the short distances involved. In most cases, where the local post office was not used, the distance to travel was short and it was therefore easier to send the document using a messenger. Even in these cases the payment of the postage rate with stamps was mandatory (Article 4). It is also important to mention that a large majority of the presently known 'unused' blocks present clear signs of thinning, indicating that they have been detached from another piece of paper. This leads to the conclusion that most of the blocks of stamps presented in traditional collections as unused blocks were, in fact, used for franking lawsuits.

A third issue that can be raised regarding all the famous collections is: "why do the collections present a great number of blocks and no lawsuits which would give a better account of the postal history?"

The answer is again based on the erroneous version regarding fiscal and not postal use of those items. Dealers did not want to take the risk of the item losing its value due to the suspicion that its use had been fiscal and not postal. Since the market value of unused items almost always topped the value of used ones, it was also preferable to sell an isolated item rather than one attached to a document.

Once my first articles on this subject started to be published by Brazilian magazines, many items, previously unknown, came to the market reconfirming this theory. I think it is time for traditional exhibitors to take that into account and describe correctly their 'unused' items.

The next collection of Bull's Eyes to win a Grand Prix should contain judicial documents and describe the large blocks more precisely.

A last issue is related to the possibility of lawsuits presenting more than one franking on the same document. Some lawsuits travelled between the courts of different cities and were subject to changes in size due to the addition of pages, with comments or judgements, by the court to which they were addressed. In these cases, the rates of the return journey also changed according to the change in weight. I wonder how many postal items have been destroyed by ignorance. I would guess if they were kept in their original state we would have philatelic 'jewels' with various combinations of stamps paying different rates in the same document.




Figure 1. 26 Mar 1846 – Bull's Eyes paying a 480 réis rate from Itaborai to Rio de Janeiro.




Figure 2. 5 May 1846 – Slanting Figures stamps paying a 750 réis rate for the return voyage of a heavier document.

One of the most spectacular surviving examples of those items is the Inquisition Act shown in Figures 1 and 2. This legal document left the village of Itaboraí destined for the courts of Rio de Janeiro on 4 April 1846. It weighed between 15 and 16 oz (425 to 454g) and paid a 480 réis rate with a horizontal strip of 60 réis Bull's Eyes and an additional pair of the same value, attached to Page 3 (Figure 1). They were not obliterated by the local post office and were very likely sent by a special messenger. At the court in Rio de Janeiro, the judge added a series of documents and 43 pages with his final judgement to the beginning of the lawsuit. The weight of the documents increased to between 23 and 24 oz (652 to 680g). The pages were renumbered and the one to which the Bull's Eyes were attached (Page 3) became Page 46. The heavier document was then franked with 750 réis to be sent back to Itaboraí paid with a block of twelve 60 réis of the 'Slanting Figures' type and a 30 réis 'Slanting Figure' of placed on Page 45 of the re-numbered legal document (Page 2 of the original document – Figure 2). This time, the stamps were cancelled with the postmark of Rio de Janeiro on 5 May 1846. This is the only known item for which the postage for the first journey was paid with Bull's Eyes and the return rate with 'Slanting Figures'.

As collectors become aware of this I hope that in the coming years several other great pieces, which have been hidden for decades, might surface for the benefit of the postal history of the so-called 'Brazilian Numerals'.
