"Craig Y Penmaen Collection of North Borneo"

"Craig Y Penmaen" literally translated from the Welsh means "The Headstone Rock". It is a small mountain in Wales originally belonging to the Crown Estates who sold it in 1986 to a University Professor who wished to preserve its outstanding beauty, ecology and flora and fauna. It is surrounded by old stone walls which keep out the sheep (in Wales 5 sheep for every person). In 2005 the collector purchased Craig Y Penmaen to continue its preservation and visit it occasionally. It is visited by deer, hares, predatory birds such as Buzzards, Goshawks and Peregrine Falcons which use the thermal air currents from the rock to effortlessly fly around the area. In spring the ground is carpeted with white wood anemones as well as bluebells and other flowers. The collection was started relatively recently inspired by the attractive designs of the early pictorial issues but the collector soon realised the size of the undertaking of North Borneo so is now reverting to expanding on his already substantial St Helena collection.

The Southeast Asia region has always captivated the minds of philatelists the world over. North Borneo, nestled amongst Singapore, Malaysia, Cambodia, Vietnam, the Philippines and Indonesia, has a great deal to attract the specialised collector, with popular stamp designs and its social history, which is aptly reflected in many of the pictorial issues from a period when the British North Borneo Company and later British Protectorate reigned supreme. Even though North Borneo lies close to the equator and has a climate characterised by high temperatures, high humidity, and significant rainfall throughout the year; which one might assume was not ideal for gummed paper; the region's tropical rainforest climate, abundant vegetation, diverse wildlife and crucially colonial history is precisely why it attracts many to study closely the often colourful and some might say iconic stamps from this country.



Indeed, it is this alluring tropical and historical content that is one reason it attracted our collector to assemble the material on offer in this special section of our main catalogue. Reviewing the lots, it is easy to appreciate why. The diversity of the images portrayed on the stamps conjures up a time and place which is unlike any other. From the Arms of the Company, to images of a Dyak Chief and Warrior, to a Leopard, Orangutan, various Birds, a Rhino, Elephant, Monkeys, Cattle, to the landscape views of the famous Mount Kinabalu, as well river scenes and natives, you are transported to a colourful and tropical land. One of the highlights of this sale is the many Proofs and Specimens which have been thoughtfully assembled to provide added detail and depth to the finished articles. In particular, the comprehensive and delightful focus upon the 1931 50th Anniversary of the British North Borneo Company set of eight stamps. These perhaps more than any other issue stand out as the most authentic overview capturing the essence of the place and time.

As well as completed Die Proof and Specimen examples, there are a range of progressive Die Proofs, frames, vignettes in varying stages of development and unissued colours. The most eye-catching item is a delightful stamp size hand-painted essay of the \$ 5 in black & purple inset on thick card. From the same series an enormously popular stamp is the 6 c. black & orange which features a wonderful image of the Orangutan and arguably the Die Proof, of the vignette only, is a contender for the best portrait of any animal on a stamp. Although, the legendary Clouded Leopard on the 25 c. black & violet is definitely a close second as is testified by the beautiful Proofs and examples on offer.

One of the most important elements of this collection is the Printer's archive which comprises marginal sheet blocks of twenty of every value in this 1931 Anniversary set as imperforate Die Proofs of the frame, the completed design and perforated blocks of the completed stamps. It is a rare and inspiring lot and together with the other material on offer, which includes earlier designs, issues and sets, as well as latter material, it is quite an extraordinary assembly and a unique opportunity to acquire items which artfully depict the history of this fascinating country.
