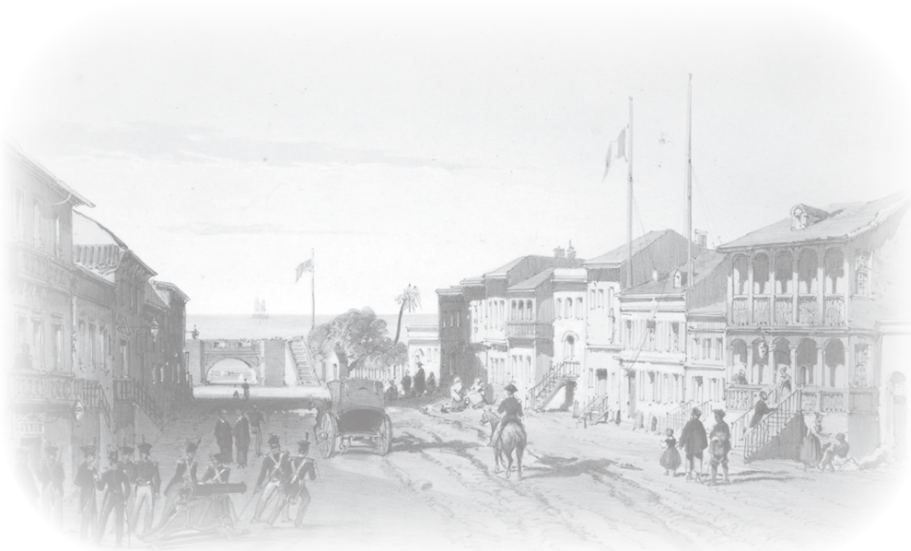

ST HELENA

The Frank Gilberg Collection

We are pleased to present St. Helena – The Frank Gilberg Collection. Frank Gilberg is the past president of the Norwegian Philatelic Federation. His collection of St Helena was recently exhibited in Scandinavia to some acclaim.

The collection starts with the first stamp issue in 1856, and ends with the 1934 Centenary of British Colonization: Issue 1856–1894, the 6d Queen Victoria in one plate with surcharge to different values; The Boer War 1899–1902; Issue 1890–1897 Queen Victoria the key plate; Issues 1902–1911 Edward VII; Issues 1912_1935 George V with the 1922 Colony's Badge issues; Issue 1934 Centenary of British Colonization. The collection comprises choice items on and off cover.

Large Star, imperforate, a horizontal pair with large margins all round but shaved at right, showing portion of adjoining stamp at base, used on 1864 cover to Lowestoft, Suffolk endorsed "Paid" at lower left, cancelled with two red manuscript pen strokes on despatch and "11" pence in crayon manuscript credit to GB below. "London / Paid" cds in red (Feb 25) and Lowestoft arrival on reverse of the following day. The adhesives sensibly treated to reduce sulphurisation otherwise a fine and extremely rare first issue cover. Cert. BPA (2007).

Large Star, imperforate, the album page with unused examples (4), with three showing good to large margins all round; and used examples (6) with fine four margin example cancelled in red and five with at least one margins shaved but all cancelled in red by cork handstamps or in manuscript. Condition varies but a fine study lot of this rare stamp $G_i = \text{£ } 3'500+$.
