This book dealing with the first stamp issue of Brazil, and including details of all known covers was first published in 1999. On 152 pages it included numerous black and white illustrations (many of them of poor quality). At that time 175 covers had been recorded.

Today, almost 15 years later, thanks to the author's continuing research and also to some spectacular auctions in recent years, more than 270 covers have now been documented, together with all the available information which the author has collected just as meticulously as in the first edition. This includes some dubious covers as well as some clearly identified forgeries.

For the first time, the edition will be trilingual: Portuguese – English – German.
