

One Penny original die I, used for the laying down of all Line Engraved One Penny printing plates from 1840 to 1854.

1840, One Penny black, plate 1 and plate 2, each lettered TG, cut from the Imprimatur sheets. The two first plates used to print the first postage stamps of the world distributed in the early days of May 1840!



First Day: 6 May 1840, One Penny Black used on entire from London with House of Common wax seal on reverse, to Edward Pease, the "Father of the Railway" and co-founder of the Stockton & Darlington Railway Company.




