

# **NEW GUINEA**

### The largest island within the Southern Hemisphere and Oceania


1828	Netherlands formally claimed the western half of the island as Netherlands New Guinea $\boxed{1}$
1883	The British colony of Queensland annexed south-eastern New Guinea in the name of the British Government 2
1884	Germany claimed north-eastern New Guinea as German New Guinea (or Kaiser-Wilhelms-Land) 3
1884	The south-eastern territory became a British protectorate
1888	Annexed by Britain as a British Colony named British New Guinea
1902/06	British government transferred responsibility over south-east New Guinea to Australia re-naming the area "Territory of Papua"

until 1942 The territories under Australian administration became collectively known as The Territories of Papua and New Guinea


