37 Filipino Revolutionary Government 1898 / Overprints for La Union Provisionals: 1898, Assembly of 126 different overprinted unused stamps mounted on three sheets. These stamps are amongst the rarest and least known of the Philippine postage stamps. Between 1 May and September 1898, local Filipino revolutionary forces seized control of the municipal and provincial governments in many parts of the Islands. On 1 June 1898 local officials facing a shortage of available stamps, signed a decree permitting the overprinting of the Spanish Stamps still available. Due to the very limited number of stamps available for overprinting, the decree provided for any available supplies of paper to also be used. Five types of surcharge are known.
The Count Ferrari collection (1917/1922) contained the original copy of the resolution of the Municipal Council of San Fernando authorizing the issue of the stamps together with 132 loose stamps and four covers. The Ferrari collection returned to Manila with Don Enrique Zobel who kept the resolution and the four covers, but sold parts of the loose stamps to Carlos Young and Don Jesus Cacho. During the burning of manila in 1945, the collections of both Young and Zobel were destroyed. The whereabout of the Don Jesus Cacho collection of loose stamps is unknown. One cover is known to exist with four stamps (Tows collection, sold at public auction in New York, Nov. 1948) shipped in August 1898 by French Paquet Boat to France.

Small faults but a most unusual and rare cover.
1919: Cover to Paramaribo, Suriname mailed by Clrence Hennan, franked by 1913/19 Washington 1 c . green in a strip of three vastly mis-perforated vertically, together with 2 c. rose, also vastly mis-perforated vertically, tiewd by Chicago duplexes (March 17) with Paramaribo arrival on reverse. Unusual: the sender formed some of the finest ever Dominican Republic, Haiti and Salvador collections.

The UN officially came into existence 24 October 1945, upon ratification of the Charter by the five permanent members of the Security Council France, the Republic of China, the Soviet Union, the UK and the US and by a majority of the other 46 signatories. A very rare item. $\quad($ Photo $=$ 19) 1881: A correspondence of entire letters (18) from New York to Basel, Switzerland each cover with manuscript Ship endorsements at upper left, with 1875/79 Taylor 5 c . blue usages with three single frankings and a cover with a pair; Banknote 10 c . brown covers with single frankings (13) and one cover bearing a pair cancelled "N.Y / Supplementary / Paid"; all in the foremost quality.

To have a better chance of being successful as a postal bidder we recommend setting a limit for the total amount of your purchases (excl. 20\% buyers premium): for example, bidding on a range of lots with a total amount of CHF 10 '000 and setting a limit of CHF 7'500 for your purchases means that the total for lots knocked down to you will not exceed the limit you have set. We know from experience that postal bidders are rarely successful on all lots. On the other hand, you might have been interested in other lots as well, but not knowing which lots would be knocked down to you and being worried to spend more than a certain amount, you did not bid on them. Giving a total purchase limit (see also the Bid Form in this catalogue) enables you to have a better chance of being a more successful postal bidder!
