GREAT BRITAIN 1840 – 1910 THE 'BESANÇON' COLLECTION (PART II)

3001 1857 (March 6): Autographed Letter Sheet signed at foot by **Rowland Hill**, written on embossed Post Office notepaper to Pliny Miles (1818-1865) an American Postal reformer whose grand idea was a 1 cent rate over any distance in the USA, part of the letter with outstanding content on the Transatlantic Route - *"When I receive your pamphlet on Ocean Steam Navigation I shall peruse with much interest your remarks on the existing high rates of postage between this country and America, but I cannot for a moment acknowledge that any blame attaches to this Office. We proposed some months since to reduce the rate, and the measure is now under the consideration of the United States Post Office. I remain, Yours truly, Rowland Hill". A rare and fascinating letter.*

Remark: An ideal addition to the "Congressional Mulready" for presentation to the United States Senate in conjunction with Daniel Webster's resolution dated 10 June 1840 relative to a reduction of the postage on letters.

Pick of the Pack

TWO PENCE on 'Dickinson' Silk Thread Paper

On 9 March 1841 the printers Perkins Bacon returned in a letter to John Dickinson F.R.S. "...five small pieces of paper, which we have printed, three of them in pink and two in blue ink, and gummed on the backs...". The five small pieces of paper had "silk" threads embedded in them for additional security against possible postal fraud. But the paper samples were small: only 8 stamps each, from the 1841, Two Pence small Trial plate of twelve. They were part of printing experiments to test if the 'Crown' watermarked paper could be substituted by 'Silk Thread Safety Paper', invented by John Dickinson F.R.S., of Dickinson & Co., Apsley Hill near Hemel Hempstead.

34 years later, in 1875, John Dickinson jr. found in Abbot's Hill, King's Langley, in the house of his father, various notes and memorabilia connected with paper making. John Dickinson jr. gave his find to his nephew Lewis Evans, who was seriously interested in stamp collecting. Lewis Evans later reported in 'The British Philatelist', vol. XIII, 1920/21, on pages 37-39 about the original find: "The two most important postage stamp items were two blocks of eight, one in red and the other in blue, of the trial stamps referred to in the accompanying letter of March 9th.....from Joshua B.Bacon.....". The red block was identified to originate from positions Nos. 1-4/5-8 and the blue block from position Nos. 5-8/9-12 of the 1841, 2d. blue small Trial plate of twelve.

Confirmed by another letter from Rowland Hill to John Dickinson F.R.S. dated March 27th.,1841, Hill had returned to Dickinson "....specimens of your new label paper (which have been printed)", which were most likely the two blocks of eight found by Dickinson jr. in 1875. Most probably Hill had kept the other three blocks which, after his death, found their way on the market through Rowland Hill's son Pearson Hill.

Lewis Evens gave his



two blocks in exchange to His Majesty King George V for (unspecified) various essays "....as well as the specimens of this Two Pence with silk thread, which he had. Of the four stamps which His Majesty gave...in exchange, there was one red, No.7, and three blue, No. 9 and a pair Nos. 11 and 12".

Since the Royal Collection still incorporates the two blocks of eight, only a maximum of eight 2d. blue and sixteen 2d. red on Dickinson silk thread paper remain for collectors. Three specimens of these are housed in the Phillips Collection in the National Postal Museum (N.P.M.) in London, thus reducing the number of available Trials to just seven 2d. blue and fourteen 2d. red.

The Karl Louis Card Index has records of the 2d. blue from position Nos. 6, 7 and 9 – 12, lacking only position Nos. 5 and 8. From the sixteen 2d. red only three positions, namely Nos. 1, 2 and 4, have never been seen by Karl.

The BESANÇON Collection contains a wonderful lower right corner copy of a 2d. red from position No. 8. The second 2d. red from position No. 8 is in the Phillips Collection in the N.P.M. The BESANÇON corner example is from the 'DURHAM' collection (1993), and the Bob Cooley (1995) collection. It is illustrated in Stanley Gibbons Specialised Stamp Catalogue vol.1.

'OLD' and 'NEW' Design! The Change from Large White to Large Coloured Corner Letters

In February 1872 the stamp printers De La Rue submitted to the Board of Inland Revenue three sets of coloured die proofs for the seven low value stamps in use showing coloured corner letters instead of white corner letters. For comparison De La Rue also attached the seven low values in the old design in similar die proofs for comparison. The sets were handstamped 'OLD' and 'NEW' respectively. The reason for the change of the design proposed by De La Rue was to speed up production of printing plates due to increasing demand for adhesive stamps. In addition to the three sets of 'OLD' & 'NEW' die proofs delivered to the Board of Inland Revenue, De La Rue kept another set for their archive, making a total of four sets produced.

The History of the 'Four sets'

Robert B. Galland studied and listed in 'Surface Printed Postage Stamps 1855-1883 - Low Values' (2009) for the first time the individual 'four sets'. Bob stated 'Set 1' now being in the Royal Collection. 'Set 2' and 'Set 3' have been seen in private hands and in auction. 'Set 4' was offered for the first time on the market in December 1976, when Robson Lowe sold the holding of the Board of Inland Revenue. This 'Set 4' was bought by the National Postal Museum, thus today only two sets in private hands are possible. The 'BESANÇON' collection contains a fascinating pair of the 9d. 'OLD' & 'NEW' die proofs, the 'NEW' die proof being endorsed in pencil "approved 11 March 1872 - 2280/72" - this stated to be in Ormond Hill's handwriting.

Robert B. Galland's Research

Based on Bob Galland's research and supported by Karl's Card Index, the 'BESANÇON' 9d. 'OLD' & 'NEW' pair of die proofs originate from 'Set 2'. They are unique in private hands



in regard of the following aspects: From 'Set 3' only the 9d. 'NEW' design die proof is recorded, but very much reduced in size and therefore with the handstamp 'NEW' missing. The 9d. 'OLD' design die proof from 'set 3' has never been found, neither by Robert Galland, nor is it recorded in Karl's Card Index. So the 'BESANÇON' 9d. pair of the 'OLD' & 'NEW' die proofs must originate from 'Set 2'. Thus the 9d. 'OLD' die proof is unique in private hands, the 9d. 'NEW' die proof is also unique in private hands showing the handstamp 'NEW'!

Prominent Provenances

Confirmed provenances of the 'BESANÇON' 9d. pair of die proofs in Karl's Card Index are most prominent: The first record could be traced to the W.E. Sugden collection sold by Robson Lowe in January 1951. They were bought by Major K.M. Beaumont, C.B.E., D.S.O, President of the Royal Philatelic Society, London, from 1953-1956 and first president of the Great Britain Philatelic Society. Major K.M. Beaumonts collection was sold through Robson Lowe by auction in December 1965 and the 9d. pair of die proofs went into the collection of Dr. Douglas Latto F.R.P.S.L. (sold in by auction in October 1992) one of Britain's foremost gynaecological specialists.

Since 1992 the pair of die proofs have rested in the 'BESANÇON' collection. Never exhibited by the collector, only very few people have ever had the chance to see them. Now it is not only the chance to see them, it is the chance to own them.

CONDITION OF SALE

1. The auction will take place publicly and voluntarily. Participation means acceptance in full of the Terms of Auction, considered as known, of Corinphila Auktionen AG (hereafter referred to as the Auctioneer) by the Purchaser (hereafter also referred to as the Bidder or Buyer).

2. All lots mentioned in the catalogue may be inspected by Bidders before or during the auction. The Bidder will be held responsible for any damage caused during the viewing. The Auctioneer has absolute discretion to deviate from the lotting order, to combine two or more lots or to withdraw any lot from the auction. The estimated prices in the catalogue are not binding. The Auctioneer is also authorized to refuse any person's attendance at the auction without giving any reason.

3. The lots are described with greatest care and to the best of the Auctioneer's knowledge. The descriptions do not, however, constitute any particular guarantee. The catalogue illustration prevails as regards the margin, centring, separation and postmark of the stamps. Claims concerning quality and authenticity of single lots must be made immediately by the Buyer being personally present. In the case of written bids for single lots, claims must be made in writing within three days after receipt of the goods. In the case of collections or mixed lots containing two or more stamps which are not described individually, no claims will be accepted regarding quality and authenticity. Complaints must also be refused if the stamps are not returned in the original condition, or if they have been altered afterwards by the Buyer, except in the case of marks made by a recognised expert who is responsible for his errors.

4. The Auctioneer is liable for the authenticity of all single lots sold for a period of 5 years. This guarantee is expressly excluded in respect of collections, accumulations or mixed lots containing more than two stamps which are not described individually - those lots are excluded from any claims. The bidding for single lots which have been certified by an expert denotes the acceptance of the certificate by the Buyer, and in this case the Auctioneer cannot be held liable. If a prospective buyer wishes to bid with an extension on any single lot, the auctioneer must receive notice in writing at least 24 hours prior to the day of the auction; this written notice must give the reason why an extension is required and whose expert opinion is to be sought; the latter must be agreed by the auctioneer. Extensions for expert opinion will normally only be considered for reasons of genuineness or classification; requests for extension for reasons of condition will be decided by the auctioneer on behalf of the vendor prior to the sale. The auctioneer reserves the right to cancel any bid with an extension (notifying the bidder of his action) if in his opinion the item is not as described within the terms of the request for extension. All extensions must be cleared within 20 days of the auction, after which time the right of return is forfeited. Extensions are not granted on mixed lots or collections. All costs and charges for expert opinions are the responsability and liability of the buyers.

5. The lots will be sold to the highest Bidder upon three calls. The Buyer shall pay a commission of 22% added to the hammer price. Bidders are bound to their bids if a subsequent higher bid is invalid or immediately refused by the Auctioneer.

7. Written bids which are higher than the best bid of a Bidder present will be considered carefully and in the Bidder's interest but without prejudice. Written bids received later than 2 hours before the start of the auction sale session may not be processed. In the case of two or more identical bids, the first bid received will be deemed to be the succesful bid. In case of doubt, disputes or misunderstandings, the lot will be auctioned again. This decision will be made by the Cantonal authority.

8. Upon the fall of the Auctioneer's hammer, a sales contract is entered into between the Auctioneer and the Bidder. The Buyer is obliged to accept the goods. The risk passes to the Buyer with the fall of the hammer; title of ownership, however, passes to the Buyer only after full payment of the total amount due. 9. The total amount due is payable in Swiss Francs (CHF). Foreign currencies will be accepted to the extent of the amounts credited by a principal Swiss bank; any costs arising from exchange rate differences will be borne by the bidder. In addition to the hammer price including the 22% commission, the Swiss value-added tax (VAT) of 7.7% is payable. 15. The auction and any subsequent legal relationship are subject to Swiss law. Place of execution and place of juristiction is Zurich 1. The Auctioneer, however, reserves the right to sue the Buyer at his place of residence. Unless any special regulations have been made in these terms of auction, the rules under the decree passed by the Zurich Court of Appeals on actions relating to voluntary public auctions dated 19.12.1979 shall apply.
