





Due to the damage to 'ED', the offered stamp was cut from the multiple. The remaining irregular block of eight was in the Cooley and Buranasombati collections. This was again split, with a pair DC-DD appearing in Grosvenor (16 April 2002, lot 366) and the block of six DE-DG / ED-EG in Bonhams (14 Feb 2002). From the auction descriptions above, 'EC' was always one of the faultless stamps in the original multiple.

Note: From the block of 13 unused stamps forwarded by Jas. Campbell to G.H. Backhoffner at the Polytechnic Institution on the 9th February 1841: "Sir, I have much pleasure in transmitting to you herewith, by permission of Colonel Maberly, two sheets of the Penny Labels, one black, the other red - and a third sheet Two. Penny blue, the whole free from the adhesive preparation". The three sheets were sent as Official notice had been taken of the blueing of the paper and it is presumed that the stamps were sent to Mr. Backhoffner to investigate the discolouration. The sheets were unlikely to have been sent without gum as this may have been a cause of the 'discolouration'. See the 'British Philatelist', 1915-16, page 82.

King Carol II of Romania

On September 7, 1940, a very special train was waiting to depart from Bucharest. Loaded in haste with treasures from the Royal Palace, the train under steam was waiting for some prominent passengers: Carol II, King of Romania, accompanied by his mistress, servants, three poodles, two pekinese, parts of the Royal art collection and his famous stamp collection. The day before King Carol II was forced by the Antonescu's pro-German Iron Guard and a mob baying in the streets for his blood, to abdicate the throne in favour of his son Michael.

The train carriages were sealed and the train immediately departed, heading at full speed towards the Yugoslavian border. Shortly before reaching Yugoslavia the Iron Guard caught up and opened fire on the Royal train. King Carol and his mistress Magda Lupescu had to lie on the floor of their carriage to save their lives.

Finally, the train crossed the Romanian — Yugoslavian border with the prominent passengers uninjured and the valuable freight intact. Amongst the stamps on board the Royal train was an enormously rare British stamp in the King's collection: One of the finest preserved Great Britain 1878, ONE POUND brown-lilac with Watermark 'Maltese Cross', lettered FH, in mint condition. It is believed that King Carol had purchased the stamp on 23 February 1933, when the mint ONE POUND was sold as lot 4652 at the London stamp auction house Plumridge & Co. as part of the L. Praportchetovitch collection.

In exile, King Carol II and Magda Lupescu married in 1947 and settled in Spain, Portugal and Mexico. From time to time, they had to sell parts of the King's stamp collection to raise funds, including the mint 1878, ONE POUND which was offered and sold in March 1951 in New York.
