«Der Innerösterreichische Postkurs Wien – Graz – Venedig 1523 -1805»


‘Finlandia’ 2017 Die mit Gold prämierte Sammlung

1564 erfolgte die Gründung von Innerösterreich durch die Teilung der Österreichischen Erblande. Nach der Einstellung des Polnischen Postkurses von Krakau – Wien – Venedig (1572), versuchte Erzherzog Karl II von Innerösterreich aus wirtschaftspolitischen Gründen die verlorengegangene Postverbindung aufrecht zu erhalten und gründete das Innerösterreichische Postamt in Venedig (1573). Erzherzog Karl II ernannte Johann Baptista von Paar in Graz zum Postmeister für Innerösterreich, dies in Konkurrenz zur Thurn und Taxis Reichspost, die die Post von Venedig über den Brennerpass nach Innsbruck leitete. Das Innerösterreichische Postamt in Venedig fungierte als eine Art Transit-Auslandpostamt und hatte als Hauptaufgabe den beschleunigten Transport sog. ‘erbländischer’ Briefe sowie die Postroutenanschlüsse nach Italien und zum Landpostkurs von Konstantinopel kommand zu gewähren. Der Transport sollte einmal wöchentlich erfolgen und die längere ‘Reichspost’ - Route über Innsbruck ersetzen.





Unterschrift vom Melchior Sobek von Kornitz (Domkanoniker von Krakau, † 1542) an das Krakauer Domkapitel, in dessen Auftrag er persönlich an den päpstlichen Hof gereist war, betr. rechtlichen Angelegenheiten und bestätigt den Erhalt von 30 Dukaten, die ihm der Krakauer Kanzler und königl. Sekretär Felix Naropinski († 1541) in Rom zur Verfügung gestellt habe. Da er (Sobek) in Rom nun nichts mehr unternehmen könne, kündigt er seine Rückkehr nach Krakau an. Seltener und sehr früher Beleg, der auf dem polnischen Stafettenkurs von Venedig - Wien - Krakau befördert wurde. Text-Transkript beigelegt.



Karl II. Franz von Innerösterreich (3. Juni 1540 in Wien; † 10. Juli 1590 in Graz), dritter Sohn von Kaiser Ferdinand I HRR, war von 1564 bis zu seinem Tod Erzherzog von Österreich und regierte in Innerösterreich. Nach Einstellung des polnischen Postkurses (1572) entstand 1573 ein Postkurs Graz - Venedig mit einem innerösterr. Postamt in Venedig unter Karl Magno. 1583 machte Johann Baptista von Paar den Vorschlag, den Kurs Graz-Venedig auszubauen und bis Wien zu erweitern.*





Friauler Krieg 1615-1617: Vier interessante Schnörkelbriefe, dabei Brief o. Unterschrift vom Erzherzog Ferdinand II (1578-1637), dem späteren Kaiser HRR, von Graz (22. Feb. 1616) adressiert an Hans von Mollard Hofkriegsratspräsident nach Wien den Krieg zw. dem Erzherzog als Landesherrn von Innerösterreich und Venedig betreffend aus dem sich Kaiser Matthias offiziell heraushielt, ihm jedoch militärischen Beistand versprach, Brief von Wilhelm von der Pfalz-Neuburg an der Donau nach Graz (21.4.1616), der Erzherzog Ferdinand zu seinem Sieg in Gradisca gratuliert, bedeutender Brief mit eigenh. Anmerkungen von Ferdinand II von Graz (2.10.1616) an seinen Hofkriegsrat Erasmus Freiherr von Dietrichstein in Prag, der als Gesandter für die Friedensverhandlungen agierte, sowie Brief von Kardinal Franz Seraph von Dietrichstein Bischof von Olmütz (1570-1636) gegeben zu Prag (26.11.1616) adressiert an Erzherzog Ferdinand II in Graz betreffend dem spanischen Vorschlag zu Friedensverhandlungen mit Venedig.

Der Friauler Krieg (auch Gradiscaner Krieg oder Uskokenkrieg) war ein Konflikt zw. der Republik Venedig und Erzherzog Ferdinand. Venedig beklagte die Piraterie in der Adria aber auch Habsburgs immer weiteres Vordringen in Oberitalien. Die kriegerischen Auseinandersetzungen, die Ferdinand ungeachtet der Bedrohung durch die Türken und gegen den ausdrücklichen Willen von Kaiser Matthias I führte, eskalierte als venezianische Truppen in Kärnten einfiehen. Kardinal Dietrichstein dringt auf einen Vergleich und versucht über die Spanische Botschaft die beiderseitigen Interessen zu erkunden. Der Frieden wurde erst im September 1617 durch den Vertrag von Madrid besiegelt.



1629 (28. Sept.): Faltbrief von Bartholomeo Bottini in Krakau PL adressiert an Francesco Medici in Florenz IT, der bei Ankunft mit 'S1.12' (1 Soldi 12 Denari) belastet wurde. Seltener Medici-Brief von Krakau via Wien und Venedig. Ab 1568 war Sebastiano Montelupi de Mari Generalpostmeister der polnischen Post und unterhielt zwei Linien, von denen die eine in drei Wochen nach Vilnius und die andere in zehn Tagen nach Wien und Venedig fuhr. Im Jahr 1583 wurde Montelupi vom neuen polnischen König Stephan Báthory (1533 -1586) in diesem Amt bestätigt, unter der Bedingung, dass er den öffentlichen Verkehr zwischen den wichtigsten Städten der polnisch-litauischen Konföderation aufrecht erhielt und mindestens zweimal im Monat einen internationalen Verkehr von und nach Venedig einrichtete.

Apr.): Stundenpass - STAFETTA ORDINARIA DA VENEZIA A VIENNA mit dreifachen CITO Vermerk: "cito / citissime / cite" von Venedig nach Wien, 'abgefertigt um 7 Uhr di Notte' und 'ein wohlverpetchirtes Felleisen, worinnen die Kaisel. Königl. Ordinari Post ruht', mit einer Valliggia (Tornister, Posttasche) per Triest, unterzeichnet vom österr. Postmeister in Venedig 'Dall Imperiale Regia Austriaca Posta - Giacomo Sceninano'. - Ein Felleisen war bei der Post die Bezeichnung für das Behältnis, in das die Briefschaften eingelegt wurden. Es wurde verschlossen und einem Postreiter zur Beförderung auf die nächste Pferdewechselstation übergeben. Am Bestimmungsort wurde das Felleisen geöffnet, und die darin befindlichen Briefe wurden an die Empfänger weitergeleitet. Damit ist das Postfelleisen ein Vorläufer des späteren Postsacks. Der mittelhochdeutsche Begriff 'Felleisen' stammt jedoch nicht von 'Fell', sondern vom französischen Begriff 'valise' (= Koffer). Im Allemannischen als 'Väl -iise' ausgesprochen konnte das durchaus auch als Fäll-iise (Eisen) verstanden werden, das später zum Hochdeutschen 'Felleisen' mutierte.'
