
The Exhibition collection «From Jamboree to Jamboree» documents the first nine Jamborees from the first World Jamboree 1920 at Olympia / Richmond, London up to the Jubilee event 1957 in Sutton Park Birmingham; thereafter continuing with the Worldwide Boys Scout Movement with Highlights of the early Scouts' movements in Tsarist Russia in 1910, the Scout Movement in Czechoslovakia in 1918/19, Thailand Scout Issues 1920/24 as well as National Jamborees held in Romania (1934/36), All India Jamboree (1937) in Delhi, The Polish Boy Scouts Postal Service during the Warsaw Uprising 1944 and a study of the Displaced Persons Camps post after WWII in Germany.

On January 24, 1908, the Boy Scouts movement began in England with the publication of the first installment of Robert Baden-Powell's handbook 'Scouting for Boys'. Boys loved the lessons on tracking, observation and organized elaborate games using the book. Hearing this, Baden-Powell decided to write a non-military field manual for adolescents that would also emphasize the importance of morality and good deeds. First, however, he decided to try out some of his ideas on an actual group of boys. On July 25, 1907, he took a diverse group of 21 adolescents to Brownsea Island in Poole Harbour, Dorsetshire where they set up camp for a fortnight. With the aid of other instructors, he taught the boys about camping, observation, deduction, woodcraft, boating, life-saving, patriotism, and chivalry. Many of these lessons were learned through inventive games that were very popular with the boys. The first Boy Scouts meeting was a great success. With the success of Scouting for Boys, Baden-Powell set up a central Boy Scouts office, which registered new Scouts and designed a uniform. By the end of 1908, there were 60,000 Boy Scouts, and troops began springing up in British Commonwealth countries across the globe. In September 1909, the first national Boy Scout meeting was held at the Crystal Palace in London. Over ten thousand Scouts attended, including a group of uniformed girls who called themselves the Girl Scouts. In 1910, Baden-Powell organized the Girl Guides as a separate organization.

4298 First World Jamboree Olympia London 1907 (June 19): Original handwritten and signed letter from Lieutenant-General Baden Powell on the 'Horse Guards Whitehall S.W.' stationery lettersheet writing: "I'm thinking of having a small camp of boys for a week in Dorsetshire early in August, 1st to 8th. I should be glad to include six boys from the Boy's Brigade if you cand send them. I should not charge them anything - unless you think it is polite to do so. I propose to teach them my new form of Scouting for Boys". The first recorded letter, the genesis of the idea and the beginning of the Scout Movement, of great historical importance.

4330A 1910 (July 2): Fine and clear strike of circular Russian Scout handstamp: 'Russkiy Skaut - Bud Gotov' (Be Prepared) in violet, used on 4 kop. stationery card from Charkow Station to Montreux, Switzerland backstamped on arrival July 10th. Very early card of one of the first Scout Camps in Russia.

In 1908, Baden-Powell's book Scouting for Boys came out in Russia by the order of Tsar Nicholas II. On April 30 1909 the young Colonel Oleg Pantyukhov organized the first Russian Scout 'Beaver' troop in Pavlovsk, a town near Tsarskoye Selo, St. Petersburg.
