

The 1893 Old Calabar Provisionals

In 1885 a major Conference in Berlin was held where the major European powers ostensibly carved up Africa for colonisation. The area of Nigeria was given to Britain which formalised the Oil River Protectorate. Its name derives from the palm oil that was the chief product of the area. Britain intended to control the trade coming down the river. In 1893 the territory was renamed 'Niger Coast Protectorate' and expanded to include the region from Old Calabar to Lagos Colony and Protectorate.

Mail steamers called regularly at Old Calabar. The first postal system was opened at Old Calabar in November 1891. The reduction in the basic postage rate with the United Kingdom to $2\frac{1}{2}$ d. per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. gave rise to shortages of some of the low values. These shortages were progressively met by locally bisecting and overprinting current issues from the Post Office's stock of stamps.

The Old Calabar Provisional - ½ d. Bisect 3rd September 1893

The initial shortage of halfpenny stamps was met by surcharging four half sheets of 120 stamps of the 1d. lilac with " $\frac{1}{2}$ d" printed on each side of a diagonal bar. The 1d. stamp thus being rendered capable of division along the line into 2 x $\frac{1}{2}$ d. No accounting deficiency in regard of the existing stamp supplies occured.

The Old Calabar "Half Penny" Provisionals December 1893

By December the Old Calabar Post Office had again exhausted its stock of halfpenny stamps and recourse was once again made locally to provide for requirements. 2d. and 2½ d. stamps taken from the existing stamp supplies were locally surcharged by hand "Half Penny" in eight differing type settings and in various coloured inks. The Encyclopaedia of British Empire Postage Stamps by Robson Lowe, vol. II, The Empire in Africa (1949) gives figures of 420 stamps of the 2d. and 1'825 stamps of the 2½ d. being surcharged. This resulted in an accounting deficiency of nearly £18 with regard to the face value of the basic stamps taken from stock.

The Old Calabar High Value Provisionals December 1893

It has been suggested that the high value surcharges were created to meet the accounting deficiency which arose as a result of reducing so many 2d. and $2\frac{1}{2}$ d. stamps to one halfpenny. 2d., 5d. and 1s. stamps were taken from the Post Office stock of stamps and were locally surcharged by hand "One Shilling", "5/-", "10/-" and "20/-". Based on the number of stamps surcharged given by Jack Ince & John Sacher in "The Postal Services of the British Nigeria Region" the high values realised an accounting profit of more than £52 with regard to the face value of the basic stamps taken from stock. The Old Calabar high values represent one of the most interesting, fascinating provisional stamp issues! A collectors and a professional philatelist's dream to be able to see, describe and handle: the "20/-" set of three has been assembled by just two private collectors in the entire history of philately. This is most probably a true "Once in a Lifetime" opportunity to view or indeed acquire the rarest perforated stamp issue of British Colonial philately!
