## The Burkhart Beer Collection

Burkhart Beer (1935-2021)
For Burkhart Beer, philately was his passionate hobby throughout his life. Early on, Burkhart focused on the philately of Great Britain. He soon formed a number of collections, mostly of the Victorian era. Whether it was the identification of printing plates or a study of various types of postmark, Burkhart Beer was full of enthusiasm for the whole versatility of this collecting field. Then, around 1980, he discovered the special fascination of the blue line-engraved issues produced by the Perkins Bacon \& Co. printing company, his "Symphony in Blue". In addition to building up his own collection, Burkhart Beer wrote many specialist articles for the newsletters of the Forschungsgemeinschaft
 and the Great Britain Philatelic Society.

In Germany, Burkhart Beer was one of the "founding generation" of the Forschungsgemeinschaft Grossbritannien (GB Study Group in Germany) in 1970. His excellent contacts with leading collectors in the United Kingdom enriched the meetings and gatherings of the Study Group. Burkhart Beer succeeded again and again in inviting the best-known philatelists from the British Isles to give displays and talks in Germany. Quite often, some very personal relationships and friendships developed. His British collector friends were often invited to spend the night with the Beer family at Dachsbau 12 in Monheim. Along with his dear wife Brigitte Beer, in later years also supported by their daughter Bettina, all visitors were welcomed by the Beer family with open arms and warm hospitality. The Beer family's home in Monheim was for many years rather like a 'secret' centre of Great Britain philately in Germany.

I personally always held Burkhart Beer in high regard for over 45 years. Philately was our common and passionate hobby! He was the first person who "really took me seriously" about collecting Great Britain, as a 14 -year-old boy collector in the 1970s. Somehow in life you never forget such moments from your youth. I will miss Burkhart Beer very much and remember him fondly. It is also a great honour for me personally to bring his collection "Symphony in Blue - a Study of the Line Engraved Two Pence Postage Stamps 1840-1879" back into the collectors' market on the occasion of a Corinphila auction. A new generation of collectors should have the same pleasure with the Two Pence Blue issues as Burkhart Beer always had. That is how he would have wanted it!

## The realisation of Rowland Hill's Postal Reform and the Birth of the "Penny Pink Stamped Envelopes"

,,As far as practicable postage was to be prepaid by means of stamps of which four varieties were to be prepared:

„,First: Stamped covers - The Stamp being struck on pieces of paper the size of half a sheet of quarto Letter paper.

Second: Stamped envelopes - The Stamp being struck on pieces of paper of a lozenge form of which the Stationers and others may manufacture envelopes.

Third: Adhesive Stamps or Stamps on small pieces of paper with a glutinous wash at the back which may be attached to letters either before or after they are written.

Fourth: Stamps to be struck on paper of any description which the public may send to the Stamp Office for that purpose."

Henry Cole's diary, entry of 19th. December 1839 quoted from Alan Huggins and the late Tony Wicks "The 1840 Embossed Wyon-Whiting Essays - Their genesis and subsequent influence on British Postal Stationery", published by the Royal Philatelic Society (2021), page 84

William Wyon was directed by Rowland Hill on 11th. December 1839 "....to commence a die for the Queen's head" (Rowland Hill's diary, Fourth variety mentioned by Henry Cole)


Perkins Bacon \& Petch was given agreement on 13th. December 1839 to prepare a die for the adhesive labels (Third variety mentioned by Henry Cole)

The Fourth variety "Stamps to be struck on paper of any description which the public may send to the Stamp Office" was not realised before 1855 .


William Mulready was approached on 12th. December 1839 to produce a design for the stamped covers and envelopes (First \& Second variety mentioned by Henry Cole)

While the issue of "adhesive labels" (Third variety) turned out to be a great success, the design by William Mulready for the stamped covers and envelopes (First and Second variety) caused considerable criticism:
"I fear we shall be obliged to substitute some other stamp for that designed by Mulready, which is abused and ridiculed on all sides". "If the current should continue to run so strongly against us, it will be unwise to waste our strenghts in swimming against it, and I am turning my attention to the substitution of another stamp combining with it, as the public have shown their disregard and even distaste for beauty, some further economy in the production."

Rowland Hill's Post Office Journal, entry of 12 May 1840, twelve days after Postal Stationery envelopes and letter sheets designed by William Mulready became available at the Post Office and six days after they got valid for posting.


In order to replace the Mulready design for stamped envelopes and letter sheets "....as rapidly as possible, the Wyon design, originally intended for stamping paper submitted by the public (Fourth variety), was modified to a smaller size to reduce costs and in February 1841 envelopes bearing 1d pink embossed stamps were issued". These envelopes, together with the 2d. blue value issued in April 1841, came to serve as a model for the postal stationery of many other countries throughout the world."

MICHAEL H LOCKTON. (b. 1934)
MA (Oxon), C.Eng,, FRPSL, FSPH.

After leaving Oxford University, Michael spent his working career in the Electrical Engineering industry. His last appointment at BSI was as an Electrical Project Manager, eventually becoming the UK Permanent Delegate to CENELEC (Brussels).

He started collecting stamps as an 8 year old in September 1942 and has continued to this day. Michael joined the Royal Philatelic Society
 in 1978 and was elected a Fellow in November 1989. He served on the Royal's Council from 2006 to 2009 and was Chairman of the Publications Committee during that time. Following retirement, he joined the Society Of Postal Historians in 2002 and was elected a Fellow in April 2018. He joined the Great Britain Philatelic Society in December 1972 and served on its council for many years, eventually becoming President 2004 - 2008. He has subsequently been elected an Honorary Life Member.

He was Chairman of The Postal Stationery Society 2010 - 2012 and Chairman of the Croydon Congress in 2007 He was President of both the Kent Federation of Philatelic Societies and also that of Surrey.

Michael has displayed to many local Philatelic Societies in S.E. England and was President of Guildford, Orpington (Honorary Life Member), Bromley and Beckenham and Woking.
He has exhibited Postal History and Postal Stationery at national and international levels. He claims to be the first person to exhibit Machin Postal History in 1994 (but the judges did not understand it).

His present collections include the Postal History of Devon and Exeter, that of Cardiganshire (Wales) and GB Postal Labels.

## Wyon City Medal



Victoria is welcomed into London for the first time as Queen


William Wyon 1837: The "Wyon City Medal" struck to commemorate Queen Victoria's accession to the throne and her visit to the City of London in 1837, examples (2), one in Bronze and the much rarer example struck in Silver and inscribed "In honour of Her Majesty's Visit to the Corporation of London 9th Nov. 1837". The head struck by William Wyon was to be copied by Henry Corbould and utilised for all the stamps and Postal Stationery issued in Great Britain until 1901.
