

1858, Nine Pence, unused

Kurt E. Kimmel RDP, FRPSL and Patrick C. Pearson VRD, RDP, HON. FRPSL, state in their handbook 'Ceylon - The Pence Issues', that "Less than 20 unused copies have been recorded" of the Nine Pence. Only unused singles are available for private collections. Kimmel and Pearson continue to comment: "Were it not for a defective block of four in the Tapling Collection at The British Library the number of unused Nine Pence would be about the same as the Four Pence". The Four Pence, unused, is considered by Kimmel and Pearson to be "the classic stamp of Ceylon".

During the process of 'Provenance Research' for the unused Nine Pence offered here, the Corinphila philatelic experts noted, that the two singles from the BESANCON collection show characteristic 'rough' separation along the horizontal top and bottom, while the vertical margins are clean cut and sharp. An incident? Could they originally have been a pair that had been separated decades ago into two singles?

Kurt Kimmel was contacted and the Corinphila experts presented the theory of the two BESANCON singles having been a pair which was separated. Also Kurt was asked, if he might have more unused singles recorded. He responded, that on the census list from Patrick Pearson two more singles were recorded and that Patrick also had thought about the possibility that some of them might have been in a pair. Kurt was kind enough to send illustrations of the other two unused singles with the characteristic rough edges at the top and bottom of the stamps.



Due to the use of images from different sources the colours of the stamps vary.

Having good to very good illustrations of the four different unused Nine Pence stamps available, it was not too long that the experts were intrigued about the impression, that the stamps may not only re-join to one or two pairs. In fact it may well be, that the four stamps re-join to an original horizontal strip of four. A sensation!

Nevertheless, as long as we do not have the original four singles available as original stamps, we can not be 100% sure. But it seems at least "very likely". Future generations of stamp collectors will possibly pick up this theory and will prove or disprove the theory of the existence of a former existing unused strip of four. If so, will the strip ever been re-joined in one collection?

Ormond Hill

On 18 April 1861 Ormond Hill, the nephew of Rowland Hill, wrote to Joshua Butters Bacon the head of Perkins Bacon and Co.:

"My dear Sir, Two or three of my friends who are collectors of Postage Stamps have asked me to procure for them specimens of new or uncommon stamps whenever I have it in my power. It occurs to me that perhaps you may be able to give me a few ..."

He added on 24 April:

"... I should be glad to have six stamps of each kind ..."

On 15 August J. Upham (for J.B. Bacon) sent the stamps to Pearson Hill with the following letter:

"Dear Sir, I beg now to send you as promised ... an envelope addressed to Ormond Hill Esq. containing 6 obliterated impressions of each of the stamps named in the list and request you will take two of each for Rowland Hill Esq. and yourself and then seal the package and forward it together with a letter which you will also find addressed to him, to Mr. Ormond Hill."

It turned out that the supply of the Crown Agents' property was given without authority.

Ormond Hill was not asked to return the "specimens", and in fact, all were treated as private property. Nevertheless, the case destroyed Perkins Bacon as future printers for the Crown Agents.
