GREAT BRITAIN: THE LINE ENGRAVED ISSUES 1840–1870 THE ÅKE RIETZ COLLECTION

Åke Rietz has collected stamps from childhood. His father laid the foundations of today's Great Britain collection. In the 1960s, he acquired rare stamps and covers at auctions in London. After his father's death, Åke took over the collection and built it up over many years to its present level.

Åke has been closely associated with organised philately in Sweden and abroad for many years. He has been a member of the Swedish Philatelic Federation since 1976, a member of the Swedish Postal History Society since 1998 and a member of the Stockholm Philatelic Society since 2000. In addition, Åke is involved as a member of the Swedish Judging and Exhibition Affairs Committee.

Internationally, he has been a member of the Royal Philatelic Society London since 1998 (a Fellow since 2016) and a member of the Club de Monte Carlo since 2011.

In addition to the "Great Britain – The Line Engraved Issues 1840–1870" collection offered here, Åke is closely connected with the philately of his home country with his "Sweden – numeral issues 1872–1879" collection.

With both collections Åke has had many successes at exhibitions since 2009. The collection of the Swedish numeral issues 1872-1879 has received Gold medals on many occasions at international F.I.P. exhibitions, among others at Singapore 2015, Philatapei 2016 and Brasilia 2017.

At the same time, Åke has shown his Great Britain collection at international exhibitions, with great success. At the F.I.P. exhibition Indipex 2011 he was awarded Large Gold for the first time, followed by Large Gold at Brasiliana 2013 in Rio de Janeiro and other Gold medals at Indonesia 2012, New York 2016, Bandung 2017, Prague 2018 and London 2022.

Åke achieved an outstanding success at the international exhibition in his home country at Stockholmia 2019. He showed the two collections of numeral issues 1872-1879 and Great Britain 1840-1870 for the first time together at an international exhibition. The jury awarded each of the exhibits a Large Gold Medal.

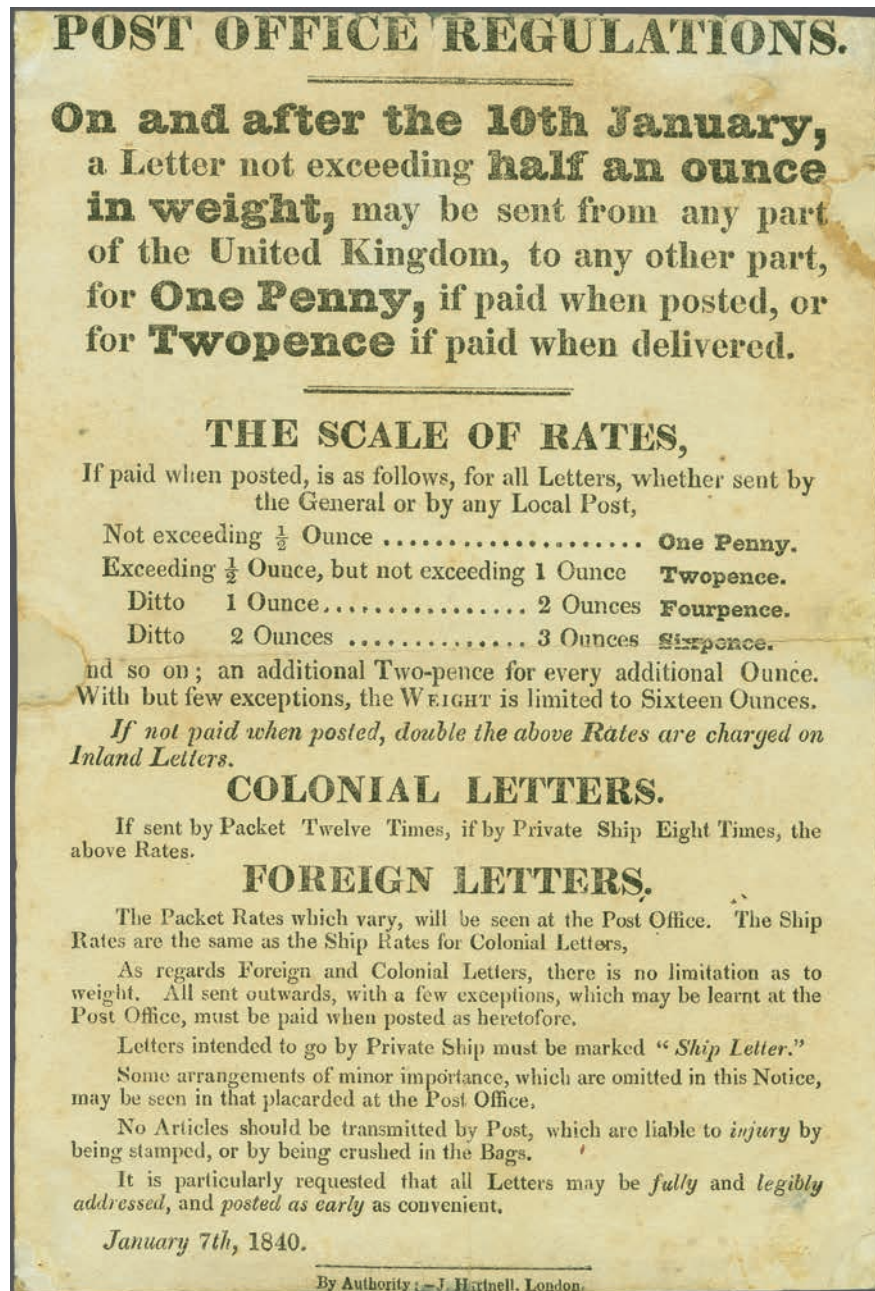

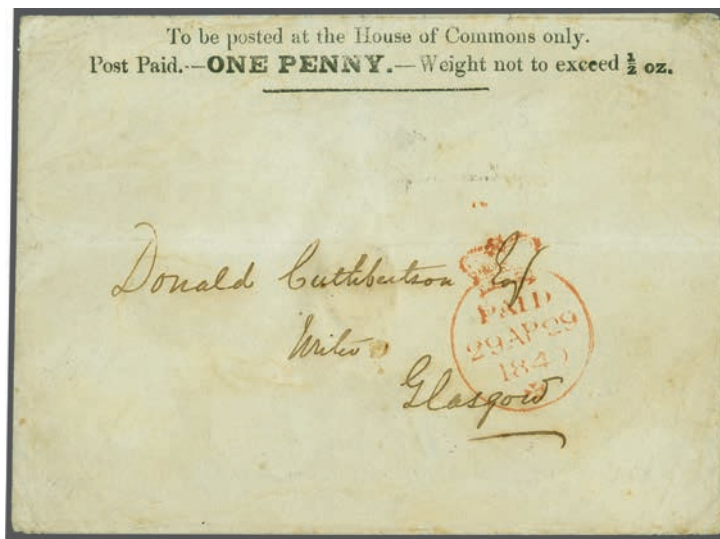

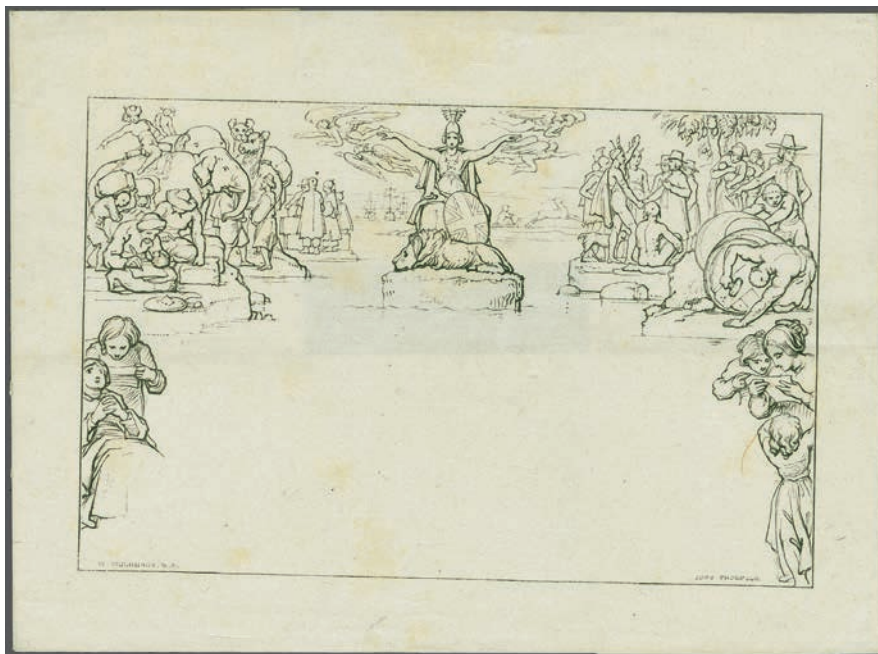

Febr. 40 / Re. Hemming". Minor filing crease toward base practically invisible from front and not affecting the appearance, otherwise very fresh and fine, very rare. The Karl Louis Card Index has just nine first type Buchanan lettersheets recorded, two of which are unavailable for private collectors, one in the Phillips collection, National Postal Museum, London and one is housed in the Collection of His Majesty King Charles III Gi = £ 15'000. 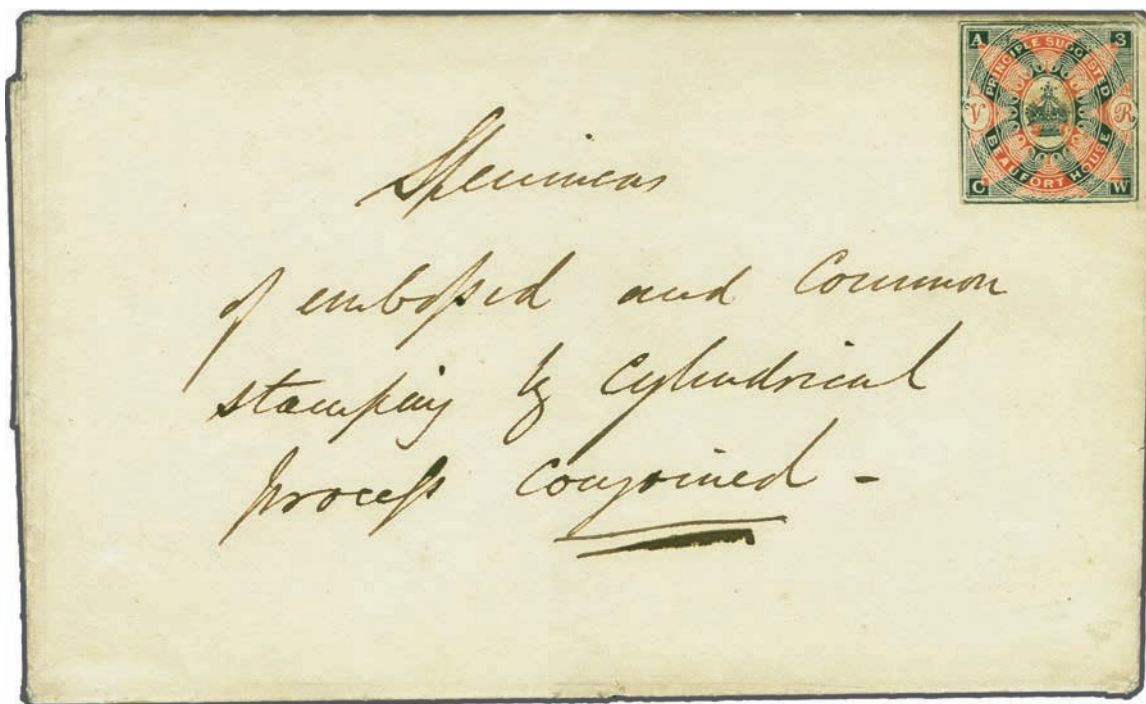

1839: 1d. composite paste-up Essay built from cut-outs of red and white paper, hand-drawn ink '1' and "1/2 oz. - Penny", generally attributed to James Bogardus, Treasury Registration number 712/40, found among Rowland Hill's papers. Just 13 singles and two blocks of four recorded in the Karl Louis Card Index, some of the 13 singles originate from a former block of six which has been split up after 1966. Rare.

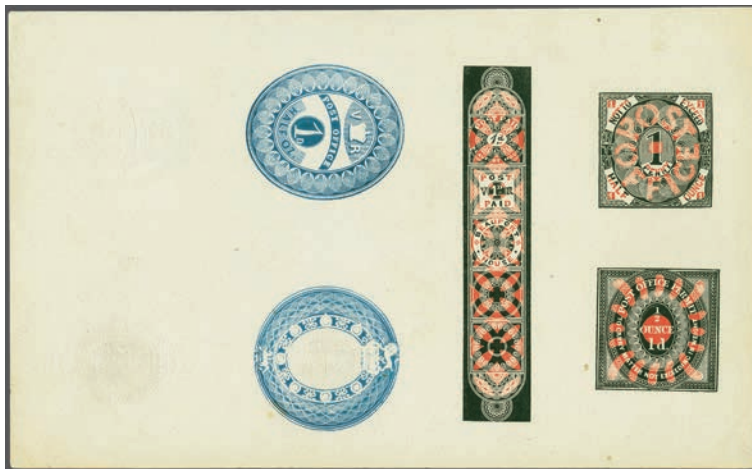

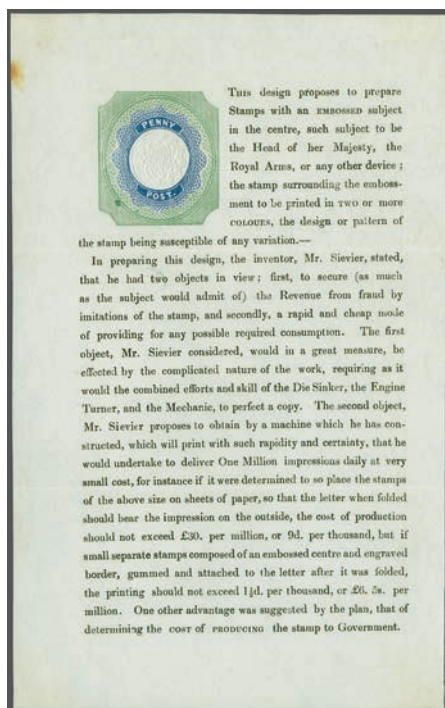

Essays (including two blue Essays with colourless embossed impressions), a reprint from the London and Westminster Review, circa 1845, using the Congreve method of printing simultaneously in two colours or embossing, very fresh and fine.

- 3411** 1840: Penny Post Essay in green and blue with embossed centre, produced by Robert W. Sievier, a complete original page from issue No. 65 of the London & Westminster Review of March 1840. Two light horizontal folds and small tone spot well clear of the Essay, which is more commonly found printed in pink and blue. The colour combination green and blue is very rare. Although cut-outs can be found occasionally, the Karl Louis card index has a record of only two further complete pages, one housed in the Phillips collection, N.P.M: London, vol. I, page 20. It was first recorded from the Col. Bates (1934) and Dendy Marshall (1949) collections and the other from the 'Windsor' collection (Harmers 2003).

The first die for the 1 d. was ready by January 1840, but was later rejected and remained with the printer's, Perkins Bacon & Co. Reprints were made in 1871, 1902, 1919 and 1935.

The original die was used to provide roller dies for the laying down of the One Penny steel plates from 1840 until 1855. Later the "1" and the words "OLD ORIGINAL" were engraved. The 1870 die print was made after 4'000 steel impressions had been taken from the die. According to Robson Lowe, just "twelve such proofs were made". Gi DP25 = £ 12'500.

A famous pair from the earl of Kingston block. Gi AS73 = £ 48'000+.

Notes: The London Philatelist vol 3 pages 290-291 quoted from a paper read before the Philatelic Society London on November 30th 1894, by the then President the Earl of Kingston: "Four years ago I purchased a block of black pennies. It once formed the top of the sheet and consists of five entire rows of twelve stamps each. The margins are intact and perfect; the right and left hand corners of the margin contain the plate number II [.....] I took these figures to represent No 2 in Roman Numerals, but from enquiries made this summer (1894) I ascertained beyond doubt, that the practice has always been to number the sheets in Arabic Numerals. It proves therefore, that the block above described is not an impression from plate 2, but from plate 11 [...]."

Frank Godden stated (date unknown): "The rarest known British piece in the world"

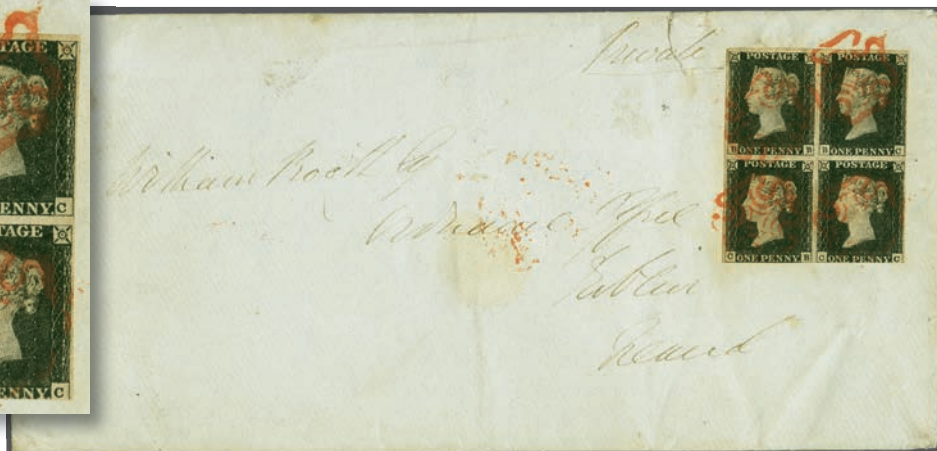

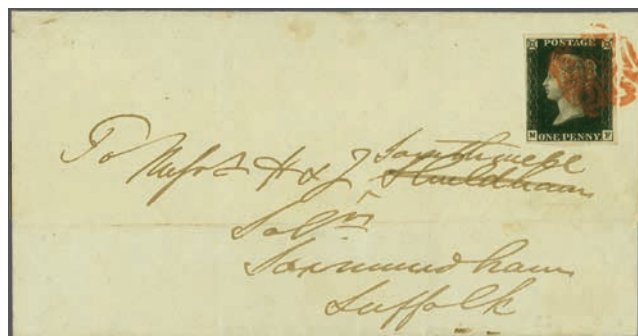

What a Discovery!

It is not unusual to locate unused stamps or multiples which added up to a larger multiple that existed decades ago. But how often do we spot used blocks that originally formed a larger multiple?

A few months ago Karl received for sale at Corinthila Auctions the International Large Gold medal Collection of Great Britain, Line Engraved Issues 1840-1970, assembled by Åke Rietz from Sweden. While preparing details of provenances for the various important items in Åke's collection, Karl came across the fascinating Penny Black used block of ten, lettered AG/BK, certainly one of the largest used multiples existing of the first stamp of the world. He was quite sure that the block would be easily located in his Card Index and was excited by which famous previous owner may have owned the block. Karl flipped through his Penny Black plate 7 Index cards and soon spotted a used block of ten. Here is "our lady" he thought and a smile came across his face. But a closer look to the block just found in the Card Index was a big surprise for Karl. The block was not Åke's block lettered AG/BK, it was another fantastic used block of ten, lettered AB/BF. At a first glance, they looked so very similar.

Similar? Could it be that these two blocks of ten once belonged together? Forming an original used block of twenty? Both multiples are from plate 7 and the letterings perfectly matched, two nearly complete horizontal 'A' and 'B' rows, lacking only the first and the last stamps.

A closer look at the characteristic uneven shaped margins between the vertical 'F' and 'G' rows of the two blocks caused Karl's heart to beat faster. After having digitally rejoined the two blocks of ten it could clearly be seen: they originally formed a used block of twenty, and represent as such the largest used multiple of the Penny Black recorded in Karl's Card Index. As far as one can say, both blocks have been used on the same large sized cover, although it is of course, uncertain whether the block of twenty had already been cut into two blocks of ten by the sender in 1840, or in later years by a stamp collector who had found the large sized cover in an archive.

Åke's block of ten, AG/BK, originates from the famous Maurice Burrus collection (1963), the adjoining block of ten lettered AB/BF, graced the collections of 'Daisy' and 'M.A.Sayeed'. Karl's Card Index also provided further information, where the adjoining 'Daisy' / Sayeed block to Åke's multiple is housed today! Will these two fantastic blocks be reunited again?

How the Treasury Roulette's name was born!

For Friday, 14th December 1894, a sale “of about 200 lots of Postage Stamps, Mostly Rare, and comprising some of the greatest Rarities” was announced by William Ridout, 120, Newgate Street, E.C. in the 10th December issue of the Philatelic Journal of Great Britain. Among “Blocks of 6d., 10d. and 1s. Octagon in mint state”, an “UNCHRONICLED RARITY, being a peculiarly rouletted 1d on letter from Right Hon. W.E. Gladstone” was offered.

Two years later, in February 1897, A. H. Stamford published an article in THE PHILATELISTS' SUPPLEMENT OF THE BAZAAR illustrating the cover. Stamford stated: “The envelope addressed in the handwriting of the Right Honourable W.E. Gladstone, and in the corner countersigned ‘W.E. Gladstone’, is postmarked 21st. December, 1852, and is franked with the current 1d. red of the period, having a peculiar and, as would appear, an unchronicled machine roulette, consisting of a regular wavy cut (....). the length of the waves four and a half millimetres, measured from crest to crest.” Stamford continued: “In the years 1850 to 1854 the Treasury had been experimenting with various processes, and it seems not improbable, that the rouletted stamps in question were issued on trial to members of the Government.” Ray Simpson and Timothy Burgess in their “New Appraisal of the Variety” (London Philatelist March 2013) valued this moment as the birth of “the myth of the Treasury Roulette.”

A closer look to Karl's Card Index clearly shows the so called One Penny “Treasury Roulette” adhesive stamps were not only used by W.E. Gladstone, M.P. but also by other Members of Parliament and “High Society”! While it



is generally accepted that there is no official or semi official involvement in the production of the One Penny Roulettes, especially not by the Treasury itself, the popular Roulettes have nonetheless kept their name as “Treasury Roulettes”.

The most likely theory for their existence is, that they were produced by a receptionist or employee at one of the prestigious London gentlemen's clubs, such as the Athenaeum, located in or adjacent to Pall Mall.

The famous cover addressed in W.E. Gladstone's handwriting and countersigned with his signature, addressed to John MacGregor (1797-1857), liberal M.P. for Glasgow from 1847-1857, will be offered by Corinphila in the sale of the Åke Rietz International Large Gold Collection of Great Britain 1840 – 1870 in June 2023. Based on Karl's Card Index, the cover has not been seen on the market since the 1950s as part of the famous Bertram McGowan collection. Perhaps a once in a philatelic lifetime chance “to acquire the highly important cover, the Mother of all Treasury Roulettes!”

"James Moore, Edinburgh": A new and sensational "Find".

What is one of the greatest pleasures to a serious philatelist, when an important philatelic "Find" is made and surfaces for the first time on the market? This obviously is something that happens less and less in classic philately. However, this is the case for the three "James Moore, Edinburgh" covers, one of which bears an outstanding franking of three 1840 2d. Blue strips of three arranged to form a stunning block of nine.

Shortly before Christmas 2022, Karl Louis was contacted regarding large and largest frankings recorded in his Card Index of the 1840 Two Pence Blue. Attached to the email was a scan of a fascinating cover bearing an extraordinarily high 16d. franking consisting of not less than three strips of three of the 2d. Blue.

Karl checked his Card Index and could not find an earlier entry or provenance for this fantastic cover.

Unsurprisingly it turned out that covers with large frankings of the 1840 2d. are extremely rare. Just four inland covers and two foreign destination covers are recorded in the Karl Louis Card Index bearing frankings larger than nine 1840 2d. Blue adhesives. As can be expected, all these large frankings, especially the four inland frankings, show serious faults to adhesives and the covers, as they were used to carry heavy contents.

Only two of these covers bear 2d. blue stamps from Plate 1.

A first cover with a 2d. blue, plate 1 strip of 12, PA-PL, plus pair OA-OB from Salisbury to Basingstoke realised, in the sale of the Chartwell collection in June 2011, £ 42'000.

The second 2d. plate 1 cover bearing a strip of 12, BA-BL, on cover from Stone to George Barker in London, was offered and sold not too long ago for £ 24'000 (excluding commission).

Whilst these two covers have the 2d. blue adhesives arranged in strips, the new find of the "James Moore, Edinburgh" cover shows the three strips arranged as a highly impressive block of nine. They are in original "untouched" condition without repairs, and despite the expected minor faults, the adhesives and the cover are extraordinarily fresh.

In all, an absolutely wonderful new "Find".

Amy Potts and the forgotten "11 Victoria 2d Blue unused".

In February 2023 Karl Louis received an email from a philatelic friend. Upon reading the message, Karl was thrilled. He was asked by his friend, if there were any records or provenances for "...a mint lower strip of 11, 1841, 2d., plate 3, lettered TA-TK showing full inscription and plate number at lower left".

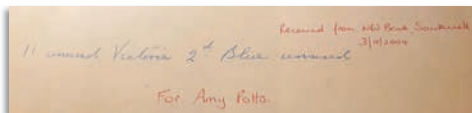
The answer was quite simple: "...nothing recorded. Also no larger block from which it could have been cut...and not the slightest idea where such a strip could have come from".

Initially Karl could not believe what finally turned out to be a true philatelic sensation for classic Great Britain collectors.

The next day he received a scan of the item! To the best of Karl's friend's knowledge and due to the lack of information in Karl's Card Index, it became obvious that the strip had never been offered on the philatelic market before, nor had been part of any significant philatelic collection.

The 2d. blue strip has been in family hands for generations, stored and forgotten in a bank vault of the National Provincial Bank, one of the "Big Five" banks in Britain with a long tradition dating back to 1833. This highly important philatelic "gem" was secured in a large brown bank envelope with a manuscript notation on the front "11 Victoria 2d. Blue unused" and an additional note: "For Amy Potts".

More than half a century ago, in 1970, the National Provincial Bank became the National Westminster Bank.

Amy Pott's "11 Victoria 2d Blue unused" takes its place amongst the most important stamp finds over the last 70 or 80 years, with:

- I.R. OFFICIAL, 1902, Edward VII, 10 shillings mint block of 9, found in the 1940s.

- 1840 1d. Black, plate 8, re-joined mint block of 18, RC/TH, plus a strip of 3, TI-TK. Both multiples have been split into singles or smaller multiples.

- "Janet Davidson" 1840 1d. Black, plate 6 block of six, AF/BH, discovered in Scotland in 1971 in an envelope inscribed "some Queen's heads given to Janet Davidson by her father the day before he took to his bed in his last illness". This block does still exist.
