1892: Postal Stationery Reply Card, 1½ d+1½ d. red-brown, surcharged by manuscript red ink to reduce to 1 d. by deleting "HALFPENNY", an unused example. Fine appearance and scarce (H&G 5). Cert RPSL (2017) which states "..red ink matches the ink on postally used cards with deletion applied after the obliteration.." and "...is not an official issue."

Note: Notwithstanding the RPSL opinion, the author of the definitive book on Nigerian postal stationery; published by RPSL (2023); states; "Even though a lot of questions about these cards have been raised, it still seems plausible that manuscript surcharges were indeed issued, at least for the single cards."

Interestingly the former is black, the latter is red. Some stains and insignificant imperfection for such a large format envelope. In remarkable condition. Rare; one of a handful used. However, often these have had the stamps removed or are in poor condition. It is not known how many of the 1700 printed were actually sold and used (H&G C1a).





One of four essays of similar design prepared by De La Rue in an unsuccessful bid to win the contract to produce cards for the Oil Rivers Protectorate. One example is in the National Postal Museum dated 23 Nov. 92. The other two are dated 23 November 1892 and 21 December 1892.

Two 1892 Postal Stationery 1 d. vermilion cards, used from Benin River, cancelled by the rare "BENIN RIVER" code C cds, one in black and one in red. The former sent 5 July 1893 to Birmingham, England, with two strikes to front in black. The latter sent 7 June 1894 to Germany (via S.S. Boma), with two strikes to front in red. Both have some minor soiling, the red postmark card is creased on the right side. However, very rare examples (H&G 2).

Two 1892 Postal Stationery 1 d. vermilion cards, used from Bonny River, cancelled by rare examples of the "BONNY RIVER" cds in black. One "Code B", the other "Code A" inverted. The code B sent to Birmingham by 'John W. Roberts, Purser & Mail Master, S.S. Mandingo', dated 26 July 1893, with a single strike to front. Has some toning and stains. The inverted 'Code A' sent to Lincoln, England, dated 26 January 1894, with two strikes to front. Minor soiling. Very rare examples (H&G 2).

To the reverse a "FORCADOS RIVER" circular datestamp 27 July 1900. Light crease to left side and some imperfection, which do not detract (H&G 3). A rare and scarce combination; one of two recorded GB postal items used at Lokoja.

Note: The overfranked Great Britain stationery postcard was used after the absorption of Lokoja into the Protectorate of Northern Nigeria. From that period a 1d stamped envelope of Great Britain is known with a Lokoja oval cancellation. That also bears an additional Northern Nigeria 1d stamp and is cancelled by the Lokoja oval dated 11 May 1900.







No mint and only three used examples are recorded with this imprint.

Note: The more common imprint "THOS. DE LA RUE & CO. LTD. PATENT." with letters of unequal height was replaced towards the end of the lifespan of this registered stationery (H&G C2a).

Postal Orders: 1948-1956 Group of five King George VI British Postal Orders overprinted for use in Nigeria. Includes 1 s. 6 d. blue with overprint type T3T 2d. over 1½ d. poundage issued at Yaba 2 March 1946 with 3 d. stamp affixed increasing the value to 1 s. 9 d. (only recorded example).; 5 s. blue overprint type T3T 3 d. original poundage 1½ d. issued at IMO ABEOKUTA 2 March 1948. Also 4 s. with 2½ d. over 2 d. issued at Ezinifite 2 October 1958 and 5 s. with 2½ d. over 2 d. with additional 6 d. stamp increasing value to 5 s. 6 d., issued at Lagos 18 May 1956. Lastly, 15 s. red overprinted 4 d. on 3 d. with additional stamps of 2 d. & 4 d. (total 15 s. 6 d.) issued at Onitsha 16 May 1956 with punch holes. 

It is most likely that this was issued in 1917.



Gambia, Pakistan and Sarawak

The Mike Roberts Collection

Corinphila is delighted to be able to offer the Michael J. Roberts (Huddersfield) collection of Gambia and Pakistan this June, with a selection of material from Sarawak - including an assembly of Borneo Camp Prisoner of War Mail.

The Gambia offering is a classic collection of stamps and covers from 1869 to 1942. It includes; Die Proofs, complete unused sets in as well as several used, multiples, blocks, sheets and scarce usages, with several rarer items. A number of the 86 lots derive from notable collections of British Africa including; Bavington-Jones, Leibowitzand, Whitfield, Weldhen, Rose, Sacher, Dale-Lichtenstein, Sir Gwaine Baillie. Mike's Pakistan collection, is probably the most comprehensive study of this fascinating collecting area, starting with the Independence/Partition in 1947, presenting a varied study on the provisional overprints, their varieties and use, including postal stationery, Service stamps, through to the 1961 decimal and locals. It spans 445 exhibition pages and includes unused and used stamps, as well as rare pieces and a wide range of covers. Whilst certain elements of this exhibit have been displayed at various society meetings, the entirety of his collection is being made available for the first time, and at the expressed wish of Mike, it is being offered as a single lot. It was his desire to give the opportunity for collectors to acquire the collection intact. What follows, is a portrait of Mike and is in a small way recognition for his contribution to the philatelic community.



Mike J. Roberts (July 1953 - May 2023) FRPSL, was an unmistakable figure in the world of philately, who also had a love for numismatics. An extremely engaging and likable gentleman, his passion for stamps and postal history can be traced back to his fourth birthday when he began to collect, following in the footsteps of his father John (known as Jack) Roberts, who was also a notable figure in philately. Perhaps Mike's many achievements can be best emphasised by his unyielding commitment to organised philately.

Mike was an active member of numerous clubs, societies and study circles, contributing actively in official roles and also travelling the length and breadth of the United Kingdom, and sometimes overseas, to display and present material from his various collections, generously giving his time and expertises. One distinctive characteristic of all his activities, no matter how technical or otherwise the topic, was his ability to entertain his audience.

Mike had a unique way of captivating those who were lucky enough to attend one of his talks, whether that be at the grass roots, or at the higher echelons of international philately. Mike can most certainly be credited with having an exceptional sense of humour, an eye for detail, but having the rare ability to make difficult subjects relevant and fascinating to all. He was also able to use these talents to contribute widely to the philatelic press, journals and to technical reference material through his writing. Over nearly four decades Mike wrote hundreds of articles which are still referred to today. His writing style, as with his presentation skills, stands-out as being informative yet upbeat and often laced with humorous anecdotes. His ability to communicate with collectors at all levels enabled Mike to encourage and attract collectors to the hobby he so loved.

As well as being instrumental in prompting the hobby, Mike's relentless volunteering is no doubt one of the reasons he was awarded the ABPS Congress Medal in 2022. His journey to this accolade started when Mike joined the Huddersfield Philatelic Society aged just eight years old, and four years later he was the Junior Representative on that society's committee. Sixty years on he remained a member having fulfilled several committee positions in the intervening years. Those that were acquainted with Mike personally knew of his tremendous energy and enthusiasm for local societies. Mike was also innovative in coming up with ways of making collecting more accessible and moving with the changing philatelic landscape.

One element he championed was daytime meetings, which helped to establish the West Riding Stamp Club, where he acted as contact for many years. Similarly, in 2014 he established Cockermouth Stamp Club with Mike Mapleton which swiftly grew to twenty local members, plus many more joining via Zoom events. Through Mike's enterprise in organising two auctions a year, which often included up to 500+ lots per sale, both clubs were able to raise their profile within the wider stamp and local communities. Not content with being a member of local societies he held office in a number of specialist societies, such as the West Africa Study Circle, the Sarawak Specialists' Society Study Circle and he was the secretary of the Cumbria Postal History Society. He founded the Pakistan Study Circle in 2000 with three other members and was active on the committee. At the same time, he served on the Council of the Royal Philatelic Society London and was a Regional Representative, and a former Secretary, President and Chairman of the Society for Postal Historians. As well as, serving the rank and file of stamp collecting, he was a member of the organising committee for the London Internationals held in 2010 and 2015, and a member of the core team for London 2020/2022, with responsibility for staffing.

Professionally, Mike was a solicitor in the area of Probate, Estates and Trusts and had a highly successful career, rising to the level of Partner at the Yorkshire based law firm Ramsdens. Mike managed to combine his professional life with his hobby and often gave advice - pro bono - to executors and family members on the disposal of philatelic material and had a stand at the York Stamp & Coin Show, twice a year, where he promoted the benefits of Stamp Wills and became a pivotal figure for many collectors, dealers and auction houses, giving advice on both stamps and law, not just in the north of England but across Great Britain.

Mike leaves a widow Susan, who was ever present at his side at the many events, fairs, shows and meetings he attended, and she became an integral part of the generous work Mike undertook in the name of prompting philately.







741 Borneo Camp Prisoner of War Mail - Kuching Camp, Sarawak

An extraordinary collection of Prisoner of War cards, informatively presented upon 11 pages, comprising seven cards including a complete set of all 5 Types of Japanese POW cards, sent from Kuching by Private Albert Briggs, a Prisoner in Borneo. Additionally, a card written by the same prisoner when in transit through Singapore (9 OCT 1942) and also an incoming card sent to the Batu Lintang Camp. The collection comprises one example of each of the Japanese PoW cards Types; 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 cards, all sent to the Briggs family in Birstall, Leeds, West Yorkshire and each showing censor chop with the red seal of camp commandant, Colonel Suga, and red arrival censor handstamp. Additionally there is an incoming card addressed to; Lieutenant D.P. Glasgow, British Prisoner of War, Borneo Camp, dated 8th March 1944, received 21 September 1944. There is also an aerial photograph of the Batu Lintang Prisoner of War Camp, Kuching, taken from a Royal Australian Air Force reconnaissance aircraft shortly before the end of the Japanese occupation of Borneo. The original was given to Private Albert Briggs when recuperating in hospital on Labuan Island, by the pilot of the plane who apologised for (unknowingly at the time) putting the lives of the prisoner's at risk during the bombing of the air-strip being built by POW on the outskirts of Kuching. The photo includes a key of 6 points of interest in the camp. Accompanying this collection is a A4 page with a handwritten story which was narrated to Jack Roberts (Mike Roberts' father) directly by Albert Briggs. Some creases and faults although in the main a remarkably well preserved group. Complete sets of cards from the same prisoner are extremely rare and together with the additional cards, and photograph, this represents a unique opportunity to acquire a specialised collection which has resided in the Mike J. Roberts family collection for two generations.

Note: Private Albert Briggs was born in April 1921 and left Britain as part of a Heavy Anti-Aircraft Unit bound for India which was diverted to Batavia. He was captured in Java early in March 1942 and transported to Borneo via Singapore. Briggs would have been in the group that arrived in Kuching on 13 October 1943. The Prisoners in this camp managed to construct a clandestine radio from material found on the Camp or stolen from the Japanese. Private Briggs was responsible for looking after a small tubular Erasmic shaving cream tin which contained one of the parts for the radio. In one incident Briggs was punished for stealing a coconut from Kuching docks and confined for a month in a cage in which he could neither sit down nor lie. When the Camp was eventually liberated in September1945, by Australian forces, Briggs weighed only 4½ stones. He spent three days in Sarawak General Hospital and some time in Labuan before being sent to recuperate in Bangalore. When he arrived home in West Yorkshire on New Year's Eve 1945 he weighed 11 stones.
