The LATI service was created in September 1939 and the first flight between Rome and Brazil took place on December of the same year with this route:

- · Rome Seville Lisbon Villa Cisneros (Western Sahara) and Sal Island (Cape Verde (European section);
- · Sal Island Fernando de Noronha Recife (Atlantic section);
- · Recife Rio de Janeiro (South American section).

The first airport on Sale Island was built in 1939 as a fuel and provisions stop over on routes from Rome to South America. The first flight, on arrival from Rome was on 15 December. The flight from Rome to Rio de Janeiro lasted 23 hours covering a distance of 9'200 kms. In summer 1941 the route was expanded, to reach Buenos Aires. This fine and comprehensive Exhibition collection comprises all aspects of the LATI airmail, with rare usages, publicity material and cards, stationeries used on both Westbound and Eastbound flights, showing many rare acceptances. The collection comprises not only the first flights, but also shows a wide range of all kinds of usages, including Instructional cachets, Censor markings and Prisoner of War mail relating to the December 1939 sinking of the pocket battleship 'Admiral Graf Spee' and the ensuing Internee mail.

Martyn Cusworth published the first Edition of his handbook in 2012, which quickly became the major reference regarding mail flown on the South Atlantic route by the Italian L.A.T.I. airline 'LINEE AEREE TRANSCONTINENTALI ITALIANE S.A.' The second Edition has since been published in August 2022 by the Italy and Colonies Study Circle.

He was buried there with full military honours, and several British officers attended.
