
The Uniform Penny Post was introduced on January 10, 1840, nearly four months prior to the introduction of the Penny Black. From this date, letters not exceeding a weight of half an ounce could be sent prepaid within the United Kingdom for the rate of One Penny.



Whilst postage labels were available for use from 6 May, it was still common practice for Post Offices to accept pre-payment in the traditional fashion. This was particularly so for items, such as the example offered here, incurring high postage charges.

Chalmers, a Dundee bookseller, wrote in a February 10, 1838 letter to the Post Office "that sheets of stamped slips be prepared...then rubbed over the back with a strong solution of gum..." and that "to prevent being used twice, postmasters should put the town stamp across the slips." These reprint essays were discussed in an exchange of letters to the editor of the London Philatelist (October 1917) as having been reproduced from the original strip of essays contained in one of the volumes of Sir Henry Cole left to the Victoria and Albert Museum, and distributed with a special Christmas Supplement of the Stamp Collector's Monthly.

In 1871, three decades after they were withdrawn from service, Ormond Hill instructed the printers to prepare a series of proofs in various colours, this example in black being among them. Ormond, the son of Roland Hill's brother Edwin, held a number of important positions at Somerset house, and dealt with both Perkins Bacon and De la Rue. He succeeded his father as Controller of the Stamping Department in 1872.

The usage of the 1d. black as a wafer seal is most unusual, and was contrary to regulations. The postal clerk, evidently still unfamiliar at this early stage with the appropriate procedure, perhaps thought it most efficient to make dual use of the adhesive both as an indicator of prepayment, and to seal the wrapper. The second Maltese Cross strike on the front further indicates some confusion as to the proper usage of the new stamps.


Extracts from a paper read by the EARL OF KINGSTON before the Philatelic Society, London, on November 30th., 1894

"Four years ago, I purchased a block of black pennies. It once formed the top of the sheet, and consists of five entire rows of twelve stamps each. (....) The right and the left top corners of the margin contain the plate number ,II'. (....) By reason of there being no registeration sheet of plate 11, I took these figures to represent No. 2 in Roman numerals; but from enquiries made this summer I ascertained beyond doubt that the practise has always been to number the sheets in Arabic numerals. It proves, therefore, that the block above described is not an impression from plate 2, but from plate 11 – one of our missing (black) lambs!" (taken from ,The London Philatelist', vol. 3, pages 290-292)

This was the first clear indication, that the first stamp in the world, the 1840, One Penny Black was printed from eleven instead of only ten printing plates.

But what happened to the Earl of Kingston "block of black pennies"? Two years later, in 1896, the Earl sold his collection to Stanley Gibbons from where it found its way into the Earl of Crawford collection. When Nissen bought the Crawford collection in 1913, he split the block of sixty in blocks of 36 (AA-CL) and 24 (DA-EL). Both blocks were later spotted in the Frank Wadham collection when exhibited at the London International Stamp Exhibition in 1923. Since then the two blocks have been split in many smaller blocks, many of which are in institutional collections such as the N.P.M. in London (Phillips collection).

The block of four, DE-EF, in the Simon Beresford Wylie collection originates from the Earl of Kingston block of sixty, described above. An illustration of the original block of sixty, possibly made by Charles Nissen before the splitting, shows the position where the Simon Beresford-Wylie block of four was incorporated in 1894.


