The Izhak Barak Collection The Development of Aviation and Transportation of Mail by Air until 1914



Izhak Barak's father was born in Germany, and he was a keen stamp collector. So it be quite natural for Izhak to “inherit” the hobby. Already as a child he became interested in aviation and airmail and so developed to become a thematic collector addressing aviation stamps and air mail. This was accompanied with looking for any book, catalogue and article related to the subject (it was before “Prof. Google’s” time).

As the market became more flooded with philatelic material, Izhak decided to restrict himself in the pioneering era until 1914 as it was attractive with the adventurous and ingenious flying pioneers. For a certain period, he had to slow down and studied electrical engineering, he married, and he got four children. However, he returned to serious engagement with thematic philately and over the last 40 years the collection developed with scarce and sensational material (Zeppelin Mail, Pigeon Mail and Pioneer Flights), a scope for which this collection was awarded with several gold medals at international exhibitions.

The Jørgen Jørgensen Collection Fisheries



Jørgen Jørgensen's (1944–2024) interest in stamp collecting began in the 1950s, inspired by his brother-in-law. He developed an interest in topical philately (as it was then known), focusing on his leisure passion — fishing, and fish on stamps. This evolved into his thematic exhibit on **Fisheries**, which won its first national gold medal in 1993 and an international large gold medal in 2003, followed by multiple large gold awards. The exhibit's final showing was at the Seven Nations Challenge in London in 2016. In Jørgen's different capacities in organized philately he contributed significantly to the development of thematic philately both in Denmark and internationally.

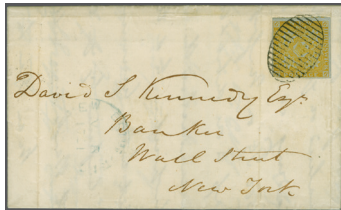

A very fine and desirable cover paying the 6 d. rate to the United States, carried via the exchange office. The 'mustard-yellow' shade is scarcer than the normal yellow and highly prized on cover. An attractive and important New Brunswick Six Pence cover - a cornerstone item for a Maritime Provinces or BNA collection. Certs. 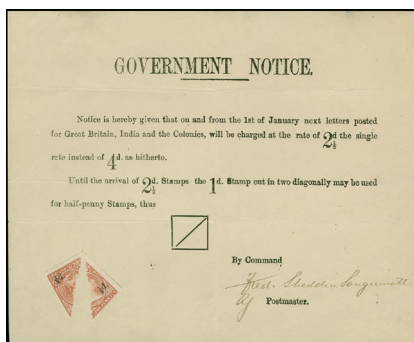

Folded as all these Notices are, this example not being folded near the two adhesives. An exceedingly rare sheet with just three recorded. Note: The example in the Bunt collection was missing one bisected stamp, the example in the Ayrce collection had full copies of the stamps un-bisected and cancelled by the 'F1' obliterator. 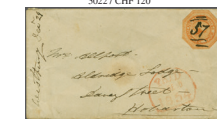

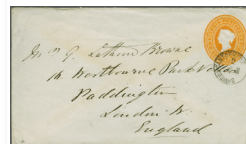

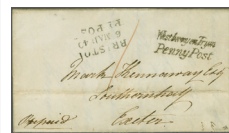

Peter Hørlyck FRPSL (1963–2021)

Peter Hørlyck FRPSL was a Danish philatelist. In November 2024 and in June 2025 we offered part I (sale #338) and part II (sale #347) of his collections. In the first single owner catalogue (#338) we presented the full format of Peter's portrait and presentation of his collections. In this sale we present part III.

Again, we have reasons for saying that Peter had an excellent eye for detail. He was analytical and intellectually talented which aided his philatelic research greatly. Although Peter had a substantial Commonwealth collection, his main interests were in the Postal Stationery of Nigeria, Cameroon and Sudan, which is reflected here in the concluding part from his collections.

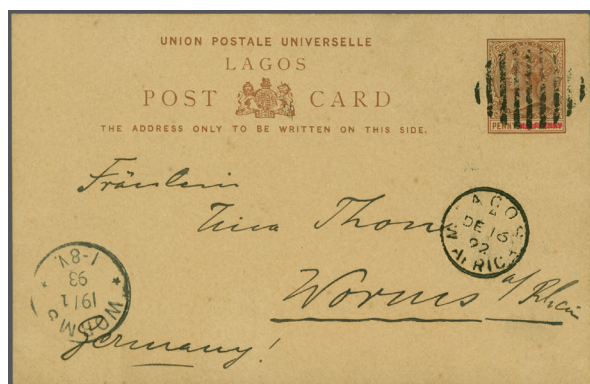

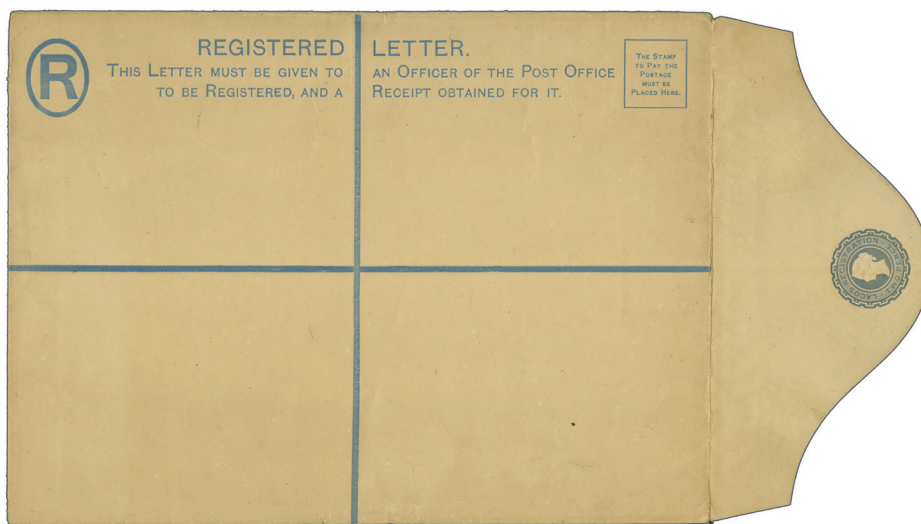

- 1 1892: Postal Stationery Card, 1½ d. red-brown, surcharged by manuscript red ink to reduce to 1 d. by deleting "HALFPENNY", used from Lagos to Worms, Germany, dated 16 December 1892, cancelled by barred dumb cancel in black, with a "LAGOS / W. AFRICA" cds in the same colour alongside and a "WORMS" arrival cds dated 19 January 1893. To the reverse an extensive message. The Worms cds has penetrated a small semi arc on impact which is not obvious and does not detract. A scarce usage (H&G 4).

- 2 Registered Envelope 1895: 2 d. grey, size I, unused, printed by De La Rue, fresh colour and remarkably uncreased and clean. Very difficult to locate in any condition, but particularly hard in such fine order (H&G C1a). It is not known how many of the 1700 printed were actually sold or used.

It states: "The attached sheet of paper is forwarded for transmission to Messrs. Perkins Bacon and Company London. The sheet shows the approximate size of the panes of 60 of the new King's head stamp plates to be made by Messrs. Perkins Bacon and Company, and more particularly the margin to be left on the completed electro from the edge of the printing to that of the electro. The places in the margin marked "This part is to be cut out" is intended to allow for the insertion of a cutter which is used to facilitate the perforating." (Signed) George Allen, Secretary to the Treasury. The layout is a to scale drawing showing the position of all 4 plates with descriptions for margin dimensions and areas where the margins are to be cut away for insertion of printing plugs to aid perforation. While the significance of this item cannot be overstated, being some 110 years old it is very fragile.
