Thematic Philately is a philatelic discipline which combines philatelic material from all other philatelic categories: traditional philately, postal history and postal stationery. In this sale we have not less than two acknowledged and rewarded collections being dispersed. We have decided to present the material under its right geographic category following the catalogue structure throughout.

# The Izhak Barak Collection The Development of Aviation and Transportation of Mail by Air until 1914



**Izhak Barak**'s father was born in Germany, and he was a keen stamp collector. So it be quite natural for Izhak to "inherit" the hobby. Already as a child he became interested in aviation and airmail and so developed to become a thematic collector addressing aviation stamps and air mail. This was accompanied with looking for any book, catalogue and article related to the subject (it was before "Prof. Google's" time).

As the market became more flooded with philatelic material, Izhak decided to restrict himself in the pioneering era until 1914 as it was attractive with the adventurous and ingenious flying pioneers. For a certain period, he had to slow down and studied electrical engineering, he married, and he got four children. However, the returned to serious engagement with thematic philately and over the last 40 years the collection developed with scarce and sensational material (Zeppelin Mail, Pigeon Mail and Pioneer Flights), a scope for which this collection was awarded with several gold medals at international exhibitions.

The Jørgen Jørgensen Collection Fisheries



Jørgen Jørgensen's (1944–2024) interest in stamp collecting began in the 1950s, inspired by his brother-in-law. He developed an interest in topical philately (as it was then known), focusing on his leisure passion — fishing, and fish on stamps. This evolved into his thematic exhibit on **Fisheries**, which won its first national gold medal in 1993 and an international large gold medal in 2003, followed by multiple large gold awards. The exhibit's final showing was at the Seven Nations Challenge in London in 2016. In Jørgen's different capacities in organized philately he contributed significantly to the development of thematic philately both in Denmark and internationally.



Peter Hørlyck FRPSL (1963–2021)

Peter Hørlyck FRPSL was a Danish philatelist. In November 2024 and in June 2025 we offered part I (sale #338) and part II (sale #347) of his collections. In the first single owner catalogue (#338) we presented the full format of Peter's portrait and presentation of his collections. In this sale we present part III.

Again, we have reasons for saying that Peter had an excellent eye for detail. He was analytical and intellectually talented which aided his philatelic research greatly. Although Peter had a substantial Commonwealth collection, his main interests were in the Postal Stationery of Nigeria, Cameroon and Sudan, which is reflected here in the concluding part from his collections.





The Worms cds has penetrated a small semi arc on impact which is not obvious and does not detract. A scarce usage (H&G 4). 

One example is in the National Postal Museum dated 23 Nov. 92, the other two are dated 23 November 1892 and 21 December 1892.

Accumulation of thirty British Protectorate Oil Rivers registered stationery envelopes. Comprising eighteen used examples, predominately franked with 1892 Great Britain Jubilee overprinted "BRITISH / PROTECTORATE / OIL RIVERS" or the 1894 Niger Coast Protectorate issue. A few in combination. Includes envelope sizes F, G and H2 and in the main written-up upon album pages outlining the specification, printings and rates. A few are loose. Includes unused and used examples of scarcer stationery which had a limited printing. Most are addressed to towns/cities in England (such as; Sheffield, Manchester, Cambridge, Liverpool), or sent locally. Various rates and postmarks. Noted a septuple weight cover (size G) franked with a tri-colour combination of 1892 ½ d., horizontal pair 2½ d. and a 1 s., which also has to the reverse an official wax seal "OLD CALABAR RIVER" over a Crown. 



Note: With the exception of the size G envelopes, these registered envelopes, with the redesigned imprint, are difficult to find in any condition. The size K took the author of 'The Postal Stationery of Nigeria' 30 years of collecting before he managed to acquire the size K in mint or genuinely used condition.


