Wiley Post Round the World Flight from US to the East 1933 (July 15): Legal sized cover franked with 8c Airmail stamp, addressed to J. P. V. Heinmuller c/o National Aeronaut Association in Washington D.C., with an additional 8c added on arrival (Aug. 3) to mark the arrival despite of fact that the real date of arrival was July 22nd. The cover is signed by Wiley Post and is one of only 5 covers carried. The American pilot in his plane "Winnie Mae" succeeded the first solo flight around the world in his Lockheed Vega 5B "Winnie Mae" airplane and became the first person to circumnavigate Earth twice. He flew solo around the world, a distance of 15,596 miles in seven days, breaking the, Speed record of 15,596 miles in 186h and 49.5' (115h and 36.5' in the air). The record was unsurpassed for the next 5 years. The route was: New York - Berlin - Moscow - Irkutsk - Rukhlova Khabarovsk - Flat, Alaska (where he was forced down) - Fairbanks - Edmonton - New York. Note: Postal charges from the U.S.A. to St. Helena where erratic at this time, the official rate being 27 c. from 1877 to 1885, these covers therefore covered that rate (the Boston cover was overpaid by 1c.) The bark "Wanderer" was the last whaling vessel to be built at the Mattapoisett ship yard. It was launched from New Bedford, Massachusetts, in June 1878, thereafter on a four year maiden voyage. Between 1878 and 1924 she carried out over twenty whaling expeditions and went on to appear in the film "Down to the Sea in Ships" in 1922 before being wrecked in 1924 on what was intended to be her final journey - the last wooden ship to set sail on a whaling voyage. In Febuary 1881 Myra, the wife of Captain Andrew Heyer, died in childbirth on St. Helena and Captain Heyer left the ship to care for his daughter, who was named Myra after her mother. The Captain returned to Massachussetts from St. Helena when young Myra was eight months old.



1938/44: United States WWII Airmail to Lebanon and Europe. Lot of 25 airmail covers, franked 1156+ with a variety of US airmail and definitive issues of the period, showing a broad range of rates and combinations. 23 covers addressed to Beirut, Lebanon, plus 1 to Germany and 1 to Czechoslovakia. Nearly all covers show wartime censor markings or resealing labels, including US and foreign censor handstamps/tapes. Clear strikes of Boston, Chicago, Berwyn, New York and Jackson Hieghts and other US postmarks. Strong representation of the 1938 Transatlantic Clipper issue (10 ¢. & 25 ¢.). Several covers show mixed franking with definitives or commemoratives. Carried during the crucial WWII years when transatlantic and Middle East airmail routes were disrupted, rerouted, or censored. Covers to Lebanon reflect the shifting control of the French Mandate (Vichy / Free French), adding further postal-historical significance. Overall good to fine, typical flaws and opening wear. An appealing group for the collector of WWII postal history, US airmail usages, or Middle East destinations. Chile - The Colon Issues 1853-1867

The Art Bunce Collection

Art has collected stamps since the age of eleven, forming award-winning exhibits of Sarawak, Japanese Occupation of Sarawak, Bolivia, the 15c Large Queen and Quebec Tercentenary issues of Canada and the Cavallini lettersheets of Sardinia.

He was drawn to collect and exhibit the first issue of Chile by friends such as the late Brian Moorhouse and other Chile collectors, who encouraged, taught and accompanied him in the formation of his exhibit, which won the Grand Award at SANDICAL, a national-level show in San Diego, California in 2010. Art is now beginning to liquidate this and other dormant exhibit collections as he prepares to publish a pioneering monograph on a subject completely new to philately: The watermarks of the AQ Lettersheets of the Republic of Venice, 1608-1797, which he has exhibited with some success.

With as many as nine printings by four different printers using two different printing methods (line-engraving and lithography), the first issue of Chile has long since achieved legendary status as one of the most complex and challenging subjects throughout classical philately and for generations has both enthralled and sometimes bemused some of the most distinguished and knowledgeable philatelists.

The plates for Chile's first postage stamps were produced by Perkins Bacon & Co. of London, at that time undoubtedly the world's most accomplished and experienced manufacturers of postage stamps, who also produced the first printing, which was shipped to Chile in the autumn of 1853. As the stamps came into use and stocks began decreasing at a much more rapid pace than had been expected, a local printer, Narciso Desmadryl of Santiago, who specialised in steel-engraving, was commissioned to print a second batch as early as January 1854. In April of the same year a similar contract was signed with Henri C. Gillet, who had submitted a lower offer. Inexperienced in the technology of printing from steel plates, Gillet abandoned this technique after a first delivery of 500 sheets, which had not been deemed of the required printing quality, produced a lithographic stone by copying the steel plates by means of autography, and printed another 500 sheets in this manner. There followed another printing from steel plates by Desmadryl of Santiago, two further printings by Perkins Bacon and two printings by the Chilean Post Office in Santiago.

Built with great patience, profound knowledge and a remarkable eye for detail, Art Bunce's collection of the Colón issues includes many important items, from scarce proofs through shades of colour, errors, plate flaws and impressive multiples to varied and interesting usages on cover. With most of the material offered having been off the market for several decades we are confident the sale of this remarkable collection will enable a new generation of collectors, from enthusiastic beginners to the most seasoned of experts, to make significant additions to their own collections.







One of the greatest collection of revenues of Haiti ever assembled, including a highly researched, eight-frame exhibit the Documentary Revenues of Haiti, 1807 - 1957.

The collection contains material from the early 1800s to the end of the 20th century.

Most of it is difficult to acquire and impossible to duplicate. The exceptional eight-frame exhibit collection tracing the history and evolution of the documentary revenues of Haiti, beginning with the first recorded fiscal law of 1807 and extending to 1957 with the election of François Duvalier, organised in accordance with the thirty-nine fiscal laws of the period, including French colonial statutes, under which numerous forms of revenue paper and revenue stamps were introduced. Encompassing stamps, documents, proofs, and essays the exhibit includes over thirty five documents, most bearing fiscal handstamps and early tax exemptions, together with more than twenty examples of adhesive revenues on document, with usages recorded between 1883 and 1940 on promissory notes, bank drafts, rent receipts, cheques, passport fee receipts, exit visas, insurance policies, notices of occupation tax, and licence fees, as well as more than one hundred and fifty SPECIMEN overprints, many in blocks, together with several examples of postal usages on cover, and an extensive study of the "Timbres Mobile" issues, the underlying research for which yielded new discoveries relating to printing dates, correcting previously-accepted data.

The field of Haitian revenues is replete with elusive and uncommon material, owing not only to the ephemeral nature of the usages but also to the fact that such items were never distributed to collectors, existing only as evidence of fees paid. The collection is rich in rarities, many representing the earliest recorded examples or, in some cases, the only known.

Amongst the highlights of this exhibit: the earliest recorded Presidential Tax Exemption (1813); the second earliest reported documentary tax document (1814); one of only two recorded ½ escalin handstamps and the unique example with dotted circle and wreath design (1814); the earliest recorded Military Tax Exemption (1812); the only recorded voucher documenting African American immigration to Haiti (1825); the earliest known use of the 12c handstamp (1821); the earliest recorded use of the 12c handstamp under the 1827–28 fiscal laws of the Republic (struck on a document permitting the disembarkation from the English brig Cleopatra); the earliest recorded use of the 6c handstamp under the same laws, and the second latest taxed document of this period; the latest recorded of only six known documents used during the Haitian occupation of eastern Hispaniola (1839); the earliest and third earliest known usages of a handstamp during the 1851/54 period; and the second earliest recorded handstamp under the fiscal laws of 1864; as well as the only recorded blank stamped revenue paper, and examples for each of the different red handstamps applied between 1818 and (circa) 1936.

Later highlights include the 1881 1 c. stamp model for the fiscal essays and a range of Richard & Cie essays following the 1880 authorisation for fiscal issues; the 1883 Erect Palm Fronds design with various shades and usages, including the largest surviving 2 c. on buff multiple in a block of twenty, two of the four known covers (1892/94), and the previously unrecorded 1906 2 c. postal surcharge on the issue; Essays of the unissued 1886–87 "Liberty Head" design; the only two recorded P2OR and P3OR overprints of 1906; the only recorded booklet cover for the 1906 \$1 Proportional Tax issue; the unique surviving copy of the 20 gourdes 1906 Proportional Tax; the scarce TM (Timbre Mobile) overprints on the 1914 issue for General Zamor's Triumphal March; the only recorded 1923 Timbre Mobile locally-overprinted "Provisoire" revenue stamp used for postage; the only used example of the 1923 \$3 Timbre Mobile; one of only two recorded examples of the 10 c. stamped paper of the first 1925 series and one of only three of the 20 c.; and one of the only recorded documents bearing a \$2 Timbre Mobile stamp of 1925.

The above is complemented by supplemental material not incorporated into the award winning exhibit, including dozens of album and stock pages containing many hundreds of stamps, booklet panes, etc., as well as dozens of documents, ranging from several earlier handstamped examples to later material following that covered in the principal study. Several Moorhouse certificates accompany, some in photocopy.


The collection also contains a large number of later documentary revenues, and revenues issued during the Duvalier regime. Revenues for alcohol, cigarettes and cigars, town markets and fairs and horse tethering are also found in proof, mint and used examples. Most of this material is extremely uncommon, and difficult to acquire on the philatelic market.

This is a collection of superior quality for its type, in most instances the material being among the finest available, remarkable given the fragile and ephemeral nature of the documents, the harsh climate, and the frequent civil unrest that has afflicted Haiti. A groundbreaking collection, ideal for expansion, its foundational research yielding tremendous potential for further study, in an area still rich with potential for discovery.


