The collection demonstrates an admirable mix of philatelic depth and thematic storytelling, with many items that would be competitive on their own in specialised sales, and a wealth of supporting material. The presence of so many proofs and essays ensures that this is more than a topical "gathering": it is a thematic exhibit-quality holding suitable for expansion, re-exhibition, or breaking-down into valuable single lots. Additionally, a quantity of unsorted loose material comprising; 53 covers, 54 pieces and 4 proofs.
