





Mail from Denmark to Foreign Destinations during the Skilling Period 1854–1874

The Jørgen Jørgensen Collection (part I)

After completing high school and his military service, **Jørgen Jørgensen (1944–2024)** began his career with Revisions- og Forvaltnings-Institutet, later working with Schøbel & Marholt and Deloitte. He started his studies to become an accountant in 1965 and, in 1973, earned his state authorisation as a public accountant. In 2005, he celebrated his 40-year anniversary at Deloitte.

Throughout his career, Jørgen worked with major industrial and commercial companies as well as insurance and financial institutions. In the later part of his professional life, he specialised in working with energy companies. He retired shortly before his 70th birthday.

Jørgen's interest in stamp collecting began in the 1950s, inspired by his brother-in-law. In addition to collecting Danish stamps and the early Skilling adhesives, he developed an interest in topical philately (as it was then known), focusing on his leisure passion — fishing, and fish on stamps.

A member of the Copenhagen Philatelist Club (KPK) for 50 years, his contributions to philately were extensive. He served on the KPK board as vice president, a role he also held within the Danish Philatelic Federation. He was a highly respected international FIP judge, team leader, and in 2001 served as president of the International FIP Stamp Exhibition *Hafnia 2001* in Copenhagen.

In 2009, Jørgen was elected president of FEPA (Federation of European Philatelic Associations), serving a four-year term until 2013. He received the KPK Medal in 2014 and, in 2015, proudly signed the Roll of Distinguished Philatelists (RDP) in Leeds. The following year he became an honorary member of the Danish Philatelic Federation, and in 2020 he was awarded Denmark's highest philatelic honour — the Denmark Medal.

Danish Mail to Foreign Destinations 1851–1875 was the first exhibit from Denmark of its kind, examining the different mail routes, the complex structure of rates, and their frequent changes. It earned several large gold medals internationally, including at INDONESIA 2012, THAILAND 2013, BRASILIANA 2013, and LONDON 2015. In SINGAPORE 2015, it won the Grand Prix International.



- 1559** 1867 (April 20): Postal stationery Envelope 4 sk. red sent with the Copenhagen Foot Post to **Reykjavik Iceland** via the Icelandic Postal Department in Copenhagen, struck by "F. P." datestamp of the Footpost / fodpost, datestamp of the Copenhagen Købmagergade post office aside the indicium. Before 1 March 1870, mail from Denmark to Iceland had to be prepaid to the Icelandic Department in Copenhagen for free onward transportation to Iceland. In 1867, this onward transportation was done by the bimonthly Steamer "Arcturus" and this stationery is likely to have been carried on the 28 April 1867 departure, the '43' being presumably a ledger number. **One of only three recorded letters prepaid with a stamp or stationery sent to Iceland in the period before 1 March 1870.**

Postal Routes to Sweden

- 1560** 'Icepost' to Bornholm via Sweden; 1860ca (March 10): Cover from Copenhagen via Sweden, presumably during the ice winter of 1860 to Nexø on Bornholm Island, bearing two single examples of 1854 dotted spandrels 4 sk. in an orange-brown and in a reddish brown shade, both from the 6th printing, delivered by the printer in June 1859, two fine and fresh adhesives in deep vivid shades with good margins, tied by '1' numeral with matching KIØBENHAVN cds and oval 'delay' datestamp of the following day alongside. The total franking of 8 sk. paid 4 sk. for the Danish part of the journey and 4 sk. for the Swedish transit via Malmö and Ystad. A very rare mailing during the ice winter of 1860, certificate Møller (2004).

Note: In the Baltic Sea ice conditions vary greatly. The annual ice cover is at its greatest between January and March, usually around the end of February/beginning of March, i.e. at the time this cover was despatched. In the period 1761-1860 ice winter severity was clearly increased corresponding to the end of the 'Little Ice Age', associated with increased variability of ice production. In 1915 C. J. H. Speersneider from the Danish Meteorological Institute compiled a lot of evidence regarding past ice conditions in Danish waters and he states for 1860: "On the 13 February the ice began in the Sundet, and on the 21 February the whole Sund was ice-filled."



Dem seinerzeitigen hohen Porto angemessen, befinden sich alle vier Werte jeweils auf wunderschönen Wertbriefen: der 1-Mark-Wert dunkelrot als Einzelfrankatur auf Wertbrief über 4'800 Mark, die schwärzlichblaue 2-Mark-Marke in Mischfrankatur auf Wertbrief über 12'600 Mark, die violettschwarze 3-Mark-Marke in Mischfrankatur auf Wertbrief zu 18'600 Mark und die legendäre 5-Mark-Reichspost schwarz & lilarot in Mischfrankatur auf Wertbrief zu 30'300 Mark. Alle Marken sind farbfrisch, gut gezähnt und befinden sich, wie die Briefe selbst, in einwandfreier Qualität. Bei allen vier Marken handelt es sich um das jeweils einzig überhaupt bekannte Exemplar in gebrauchter Erhaltung - jedes einzelne Stück stellt für sich genommen somit eine **Spitzen-Rarität der gesamten Deutschland-Philatelie** dar. Jeder Brief rücks. signiert Ernst Stock, je doppelt attestiert Dr. Oechsner BPP (1997) sowie Jäschke-Lantelme BPP (2018).

Bemerkung: Wie auch die Pfennig-Ausgaben wurden die Markwerte vor ihrer offiziellen Einführung in einer von der späteren Massenaufgabe abweichenden Form abgegeben. Der Unterschied bestand im Wesentlichen in der Zähnung. Im Gegensatz zur späteren Kammzählung 14¼ beziehungsweise 14½ wies die sehr geringe Erstaufgabe der Werte zu 1, 2, 3 und 5 Mark eine weite Linienzählung von 11½ auf. Diese Marken stellen schon in ungebrauchter Erhaltung gesuchte Raritäten dar. Gebraucht oder gar auf Brief potenziert sich ihre Seltenheit. Es ist wahrscheinlich, dass die weite Zähnung, ebenso wie die bekannte fette Inschrift der Erstaufgabe der Pfennigwerte, als Merkmal zum unmittelbaren Fälschungsschutz eingesetzt wurde (siehe auch Michael Jäschke-Lantelme: 100 Jahre Germania, Dessau 1999; S. 14ff.). Denn mögliche Fälschungen mit weiter Zähnung wären sofort aufgefallen.

Absender / Empfänger der Briefe waren die Chemiker Dr. Richard Laiblin & Emil Kromm, die offensichtlich bei der BASF in Ludwigshafen beschäftigt waren, wenn sie nicht gerade derartige Preziosen produzierten.

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
The Franklin Balloon to Copenhagen

In the cold, pinched days of December 1870, Paris was no longer merely a city. It had become a fortress. Encircled by the iron clamp of the Prussian siege, the French capital lay half-starved, its people hemmed in by cannon and bayonet. The boulevards echoed not with gaiety but with hunger. Horses vanished from the streets to the butcher's blocks, and eventually even the menagerie of the Jardin des Plantes found its way into pots. Yet for all the privations that winter, it was not food alone that Parisians craved. It was connection. For a people who had so long prided themselves on their cosmopolitan ties, the true agony of the siege was silence, the enforced muteness between a city and the wider world. Ordinary letters, news sheets, scraps of communication that stitched families, lovers, and commerce together. All were halted at the city's gates. And so, with the earth barred, Paris looked upwards. It was among the clouds that salvation was contrived.

Benjamin Franklin, namesake of the balloon Franklin (launched 27 November 1870), honoured as a statesman, scientist, and the first U.S. Postmaster General.

The Ballons Montés

The "Ballons Montés" - literally, "balloons mounted" with mail - became the fragile lifeline of the besieged capital. Conceived in desperation but executed with brilliance, these aerial couriers carried not only dispatches of war but the hopes and whispers of a population yearning to be heard. From September 1870 to January 1871, more than sixty such craft rose into the cold air, buffeted by winds they could not steer, entrusted to currents they could not control. They were soap bubbles against the enormity of the Prussian blockade, yet each flight was an act of defiance, a floating declaration that Paris would not be silenced. Among this unlikely fleet was Balloon No. 38: the Franklin. Its name was chosen with deliberation, invoking Benjamin Franklin, the

American polymath who had once served as minister to France and dabbled in the sciences of electricity and flight. The association was apt: Franklin himself had mused on the possibilities of balloon navigation after witnessing the Montgolfiers' ascents in the 1780s. Now, in Paris's darkest hour, his name was harnessed for an enterprise equal parts science, desperation, and faith. On December 5, 1870, the Franklin took flight, lifting from the gasworks at Montmartre with its wicker gondola crammed full of newspapers, official dispatches, and, most poignantly, private letters. It was one such piece of correspondence, outwardly ordinary but inwardly remarkable, that has since secured a place not merely in collections but in the mythology of siege postal history.



A Letter Bound North

The cover in question is franked with a single 30 centime Napoléon Lauré brown, the ubiquitous stamp of the time, its laureated effigy almost regal against the plainness of the folded sheet it secures. The adhesive is neatly tied by the Paris Star cancel, complemented by a Rue St. Dominique circular date stamp, like a perfect Parisian echo. A bright red boxed "PD" (Payé à Destination) proclaims its journey fully prepaid. And on the reverse, like the last

word in a poem, sits the Copenhagen arrival mark of December 12, 1870. Thus, the letter made its way, not just beyond the Prussian lines but across the breadth of northern Europe, arriving after its aerial leap in Denmark, which is a destination rarely, almost never, seen in the balloon post archives. More astonishing still, the letter was not addressed to some anonymous bourgeois, but to a figure of considerable renown: Abraham Wolff, Chief Rabbi of

Copenhagen. Rabbi Wolff (1810–1891) was no obscure provincial cleric but a moderniser of Jewish life in Denmark, a man who translated prayers into Danish and helped fashion a more contemporary Judaism for the Scandinavian community. That he should be a recipient of balloon post adds an unexpected richness: a link between besieged Paris and reformist Copenhagen, stitched together by nothing more than paper, ink, gum, and gasbag.

A Survivor of Ordeal

Like so many balloon covers, this survivor bears the wounds of its ordeal. Its corners are worn, the adhesive shows a trimmed perforation at the base, and there is light soiling from its voyage. Yet these blemishes are less defects than medals of honour. They are the physical memory of its hazardous passage: borne aloft into hostile skies, dropped beyond the enemy lines, ferried across borders, sorted and handled until it found its way north. That it reached its rabbinical recipient at all is near miraculous. It is, to the best of current knowledge, the only recorded example of balloon mail from La Cloche newspaper addressed to Denmark. In the massive catalogue of balloon post, which runs thick with destinations to provincial France or allied nations such as Belgium and Britain, Copenhagen appears as an outlier – a rarity at the edge of the map. No wonder, then, that the cover is prized. Certified by Calves in 1996, it is listed in the Maury catalogue at over €12,000. But to value it purely in currency is to miss the greater truth: this is an artefact not of paper alone, but of human determination. It is a whisper from December 1870, pressed across time, bearing witness to the tenacity of communication.

The Human Story behind the Stamp

What, we might ask, did Rabbi Wolff think when he received it? Did he marvel at the daring of the balloonists? Did he smile at the very notion that a besieged city had found a way to defy silence? Or did he simply unfold the newspaper within, seeking news of the French capital, news of colleagues or friends? That we do not know. But philately has always thrived on such mysteries which are the tension between the mute object and the human lives it once animated. In this case, a 30-centime brown speaks across the ages, not only of the Franco-Prussian War but of the universal impulse to reach out, to bridge separation, to remain connected.

This, in essence, is the charm of philately. Not merely the paper, ink, and gum, but the narrative freighted upon them. A cover becomes a witness to history, a letter transforms into an artefact, and a stamp is no longer

just a portrait of Napoleon but a key to understanding resilience, ingenuity, and even faith. The Franklin's letter to Copenhagen is a reminder that communication, however fragile, is a fundamental human need. In moments of crisis, we turn to the written word not just to inform but to reassure, to assert that we exist, that we endure, that we are not forgotten. And so, the Parisian balloon mail, as improbable as it was, answered a profound yearning. Today, when digital communication renders distance almost invisible, one might think such artefacts quaint. Yet to hold this cover in one's hands, to trace the cancellation, to see the inked "PD" and the Danish arrival, is to feel anew the urgency of that December flight. It is to be reminded that communication was once costly, dangerous, and uncertain; and that those uncertainties imbue every surviving piece with drama.

Epilogue: References and Observations

Balloon post from the Siege of Paris has been extensively catalogued, most notably in the works of J. S. Davis (*The Siege of Paris 1870–1871: Balloons, Postal History, and Philately*) and in the Maury catalogue. Yet each newly surfaced destination, particularly one as rare as Denmark, adds nuance to the story. Technically, the Franklin's flight was relatively straightforward: launched on 5 December, it landed outside the siege lines near Dreux, from where its mail was gathered and distributed onward. But the singularity of this Copenhagen letter transforms routine into marvel. In a mass of correspondence, one cover alone threaded its way to Scandinavia, bearing the imprint of war, resilience, and the human desire for connection. That is why philately matters. Not because it amasses paper curiosities, but because each piece is a vessel of story, like a fragment of history preserved in miniature. The charm of philately lies precisely in this: that through a stamp, a cancel, a faint arrival mark, we are able to recover not only facts but emotions, not only routes but human voices. The Franklin's northern flight is thus more than postal history. It is a reminder that even in the darkest winters, against the external forces and odds, people found ways to speak, and to be heard.





2.1.5 2.1.5 BALLOON MAIL Siege of Paris 1870-71

The 22nd mail balloon, the "Fulton", took off from Paris on Nov. 2nd 1870, 08:30 in the morning. On board were pilot Le Gloarnec, sailor of the Marines, and passenger LOUIS JOSEPH ERNEST CEZANNE (1830-1876), engineer of bridges, (by mission of the government), as well as 4 mail bags weighing 250 kg and a basket with 6 pigeons. They landed safely, after suffering from severe cold, after 6 hours, in an unoccupied zone, north-west of Chalet - 290 km south-east from Paris. They were taken, with the mail and pigeons, to nearby Angers, by local French people, and then to Tours, seat of the Government in exile, arriving on Nov. 3rd, 2am. Le Gloarnec died a few days later from pneumonia!

As soon as he arrived at the train station in Angers, Ernest Cezanne sent immediately an Official Message to Tours (100 km. distance), to be delivered immediately, saying: "Arrived by balloon from Paris. Health is good. Will arrive at Tours tonight. Telegraph Marguerite (his wife). The message arrived at Tours same day and postmarked. THE ONLY OFFICIAL MESSAGE BY A BALLOON MONTE PASSENGER I HAVE EVER SEEN.
