



Note: The Austrian Consulate at Scutari had begun operating a Courier Service to Antivari by 1864 at the latest, for which mail had to be pre-paid using Austrian stamps. When the service was to be turned into a full Consular Post Office in 1867 it is thought that this raised Turkish protests leading to the establishment of a joint Austro-Turkish Courier Service escorted by Ottoman Soldiers and an Austrian diplomatic official. Postage to Antivari had to be paid by use of Ottoman adhesives, anything beyond that in Austrian stamps. It is believed this solution would have placated Turkish fears of their postal authority being undermined whilst allowing the Austrian Consulate and it's customers to avoid relying entirely on a notoriously inefficient Ottoman Post Office.



2140 The Bergen-Christiania and Bergen-Molde routes; 1733 (Dec 8): Entire letter from Bergen to Leith, United Kingdom, noted received on 12 February 1734. A faint manuscript '1' at top left may be the bill number from Bergen to Christiania. Postal markings are lacking leaving the route open for discussion with the possibility of travelling on a merchant ship to Leith or some other harbour in Great Britain or alternatively routing on the Bergen - Christiania weekly post which departed on the day of despatch. Independent of the route chosen this is the earliest recorded letter sent abroad from Bergen proving the slow mail connections towards Europe and in particular Great Britain at that time.

Note: The sender was James Wallace, from Banff in Scotland who served as a merchant burgess of Bergen from 4 December 1727. It is directed to William Caldwell, a merchant in Leith from 1720 to 1734.

The Bergen-Christiania and Bergen-Molde routes; 1751 (June 11): Entire letter from Bergen to the Royal Magistrate at the Sande farm in the middle part of the Sognefjorden area, an official letter endorsed with monogram and "F5tus" (King Frederik V of Denmark and Norway), showing its official character and therefore sent free of charge. Date of writing noted inside.

Note: The earliest letter recorded to the Sognefjorden area, sent overland to the post office in Frønningen, taken out of the post bag, then either picked up in Frønningen or sent to the other side of the fjord by occassion.

The first Norwegian entire sent registered. Note: Letter written by district governor Joachim de Knagenhiel dated "Kaupanger Gård, 14 Novr 1769" and directed to Michael Adtzlew, Sande (Balestrand). Hans (Sørensen) Lem was the owner of the Frønningen estate and postmaster with a post office mentioned for the first time in 1759. Frønningen was a hub for mail into and from the Bergen-Christiania route.

The Bergen-Christiania and Bergen-Molde routes; 1797 (April 28): Private unpaid Entire letter from Christianssund via Molde to Bergen dated 28 April 1797, despatched 2 May 1797 and noted received 8 May 1797, rated in red crayon on obverse with '9' Lybske skilling, the postal rate from Christianssund to Bergen of June 1796. A rarity as almost all pre-1836 mail was official mail with a small amount of mail sent in general.

International mail connection via Sognefjorden to/from Bergen; 1799 (Aug 17): Entire letter from Bergen to Schiedam, Netherlands, partly prepaid until Amsterdam, endorsed "fr. Amst." (prepaid to Amsterdam), part prepayment indicated by red crayon line, noted in black ink "12 / 11" (Lybske Skilling) prepaid for journey Bergen - Copenhagen - Hamburg and Hamburg - Amsterdam respectively, while porto of "3" stuivers for Amsterdam - Schiedam noted in red crayon. Attractive prepaid cover to the Netherlands, rare as such.

Note: Until 1821 and the establishment of the first sea route to Denmark, all foreign sea mail was sent via Sweden while foreign mail to and from Bergen made its journey along the Bergen - Christiania route through the Sognefjorden area. Hence this connection was important for mail between the two largest Norwegian cities and as a gateway to abroad.

International mail connection via Sognefjorden to/from Bergen; 1806 (March 17): Entire letter from Copenhagen via Frøningen to Askelund, partially prepaid to Christiania, therefore endorsed "Betalt Xania" on front, reverse with bill number "140" and "6" (Lybske Skilling) noted for the journey Copenhagen - Christiania, for the unpaid onward journey bill number "2" and "3" (Lybske Skilling) are noted.

International mail connection via Sognefjorden to/from Bergen; 1812 (June 20): Unpaid Cover from Bergen to Providence, Rhode Island, USA, noted received 29 Sept 1812, arrival "BOSTON SEP 29" cds and SHIP handstamp, both in red on front, taxed "32" cents.

Note: From the well-known Arnold correspondence, despatched two days after the declaration of war of the United States on Britain. The letter had probably to be redirected since it could not be sent with a British vessel. A candidate is the brig Abindam Gray of North Yarmouth, sailing from St. Ubes in Portugal to Boston, announced arrival in Boston on September 30.

Eddie Leibu, was born in Bucharest on 26 March 1947. Eddie's parents were holocaust survivors and he was their only child. At the age of three, the family immigrated to the young state of Israel, starting a new chapter of their life. They settled at first in a new immigrant neighbourhood near Haifa, then, in 1958 they moved to the city of Haifa where his father operated his own business of Dental supplies. While the Leibu family adapted to their new life in Israel, Romanian culture remained present in the family home through different forms, such as; music, poems, literature and tales of Romanian history.

After graduating High school, Eddie served in the army for three years. Following the compulsory military service, he studied dental medicine at the Hebrew University Dental School in Jerusalem from 1968 until 1974. After graduation he held a position for some years at the Maxillo-Facial surgery department, at the central hospital in Haifa. In 1986 Eddie started his own private dental practice. Eddie is married to Rina, who accompanies him to many of the philatelic commitments he undertakes frequently. Together they have raised three boys and now have four grand-children.

During the period of Eddie's childhood, stamp collecting was an integral part of almost every young child's life and Eddie was no exception. His stamp collecting was encouraged by his father, who bought for his collection all the new issues from Israel. Eddie's interest in stamps somewhat diminished during his years at High school. At that time in his life it was competitive basketball which grabbed his attention. It was later, during the short interval between his days in the army and his studies at the Hebrew University Dental School, he returned to his stamp collection and philately became an important part of his life.

While structuring, organising, and studying his stamps, to fill the spaces he found in the collection, Eddie turned to the stamp market, consulting dealers and attending stamp auctions. He suddenly met other fellow philatelists from the community, where he was introduced to organized philately becoming a member of the Haifa Philatelic Club. Many of the members of the club in those days were of the older generation, being immigrants from Europe who collected stamps from the classic period. Eddie's interaction with them was a learning experience and an introduction to the classic era in philately. Once Eddie had completed a catalogue collection of stamps from Israel, he was looking for a path to follow going forward.

In 1996 Eddie returned to Romania for the first time. It was at the occasion of a bi-national Israeli-Romanian stamp exhibition. There he came in close contact with Romanian philately and held lengthy discussions about its many facets and its richness with the veteran doyens of Romanian philately, Kiriac Dragomir and Marco Martin. Following the trip, his attraction to Romanian philately amplified. As a result, he embarked on developing a collection presenting various aspects of Romanian postal history, namely the foreign post offices as well as the Romanian Post. This collection is what this sale is about: *Romania Outbound Mail – From the Crimean War to the UPU*, 1853-1875.

The introduction to the collection

Romanian philately from the classic period is famous for the first issue of Moldavia – the legendary "Bull's Head" stamps. However, the early philately from Romania has many more fascinating chapters to offer: Military occupations, foreign post offices (Austrian, Hungarian, Russian, Greek and French), fluvial and maritime mail services and the early international postal links established by the Romanian post. Each theme has its own story to tell and important key items exist for each theme, of which some are rarities. These postal history themes form the chapters in the collection.

At the outbreak of the Crimean War, the Romanian economy was underdeveloped relative to countries of Central and Western Europe. Simple agriculture formed the basis of the economy and society in Romania. Infrastructure in the country was poor and the vast majority of the population were illiterate. These factors explain the very low volume of outgoing mail to foreign destinations, compared to the volume from other countries in Europe of the time.

The early period of Postal history relates to the Danubian Principalities, Wallachia and Moldavia, which were under Ottoman sovereignty. Under the capitulation agreements, foreign post offices were operating in Ottoman lands. The treaty of Paris, ending the Crimean War, gave full autonomy to the principalities. This coincided with growing interests of foreign powers in the region that have slowly raised the economic status and commercial activity of the principalities, which united "De Facto" in 1859 and "De Jure" in 1861.

This exhibit shows mail sent through <u>nine different postal organisations</u>. Foreign postal offices were the providers of the international postal services during most of the period covered. The most extensive part of the exhibit is dedicated to mail sent by the foreign postal services. The last part shows mail sent by the Romanian post.

The Austrian Post offices

The Austrian post was by far the most dominant, handling the vast majority of foreign mail. This was due to its efficiency and relatively extensive network of offices throughout the country, Austria's geo-strategic position and able assistance of the DDSG and Austrian L'loyd.

Military post offices

In 1854 Romania had been occupied by a Neutral Austrian force. The retreating Russians had to close down their post offices and the Austrian Military Post became the sole provider of foreign postal services. Military post offices had been opened in strategic localities, serving the army and civilian needs. The Austrian military post offices were supplied with the stamps of the Austrian 1850/54 issue, thus bringing postage stamps for the first time to east Europe. Letters from a number of these offices bear some of the rarest cancellations recorded on Austria's first issue.

Consular post office

With the withdrawal of the Austrian Army in 1957 consular post offices were re-established. During the first years after the war postage stamps were not supplied to these offices; letters had to be sent stampless, as in all other levant offices. In April 1864 the offices were supplied with the stamps of Austrian Italy, with value in "soldi".

The exhibit shows the network of offices throughout the country, emphasizing the "Philatelic" period. Stamps were supplied to 12 post offices. Today franked covers are known originating from 11 out of the 12 offices. For the first time franked letters from all these 11 offices are shown in one collection. Included are covers from **Berlad** (four covers known), **Fokschan** (3 covers known) and the only recorded cover from **Roman**. Another interesting subject in this chapter are the rates. Shown are rates to various destinations, with low frankings on printed matter items on one hand and heavy frankings on multiple weight items on the other.

Hungarian post

With the creation in 1867 of the dualistic structure of Austro-Hungary, six of the twelve post offices were transferred to the newly created Hungarian post. A transition period followed until the 1867 issue was supplied. Some 200 covers of the Hungarian post have survived. Shown are combination covers, important rates and the Plojesti red postmark. The Hungarian and Austrian offices closed down on 31st April 1869 according to the treaty enabling the Romanian post to start its international service.

DDSG post

The company operated on the Danube River, the most important communication artery of the region. In 1866 it reorganized its postal service and issued stamps. Only a very small fraction of DDSG surviving letters were mailed from Romania to other countries – the subject of this collection. Combination covers with Austrian and Hungarian stamps, as well as letters postmarked by steamboat cancellations merit mentioning.

Russian post

The Russian post offices had to close down_with the withdrawal of their army in 1854. Russian offices were gradually reestablished after the war in Bucharest, Jassy and Galatz but the volume of mail carried remained very low.

Greek post

Offices were established in Braila, Bucharest (1857) and Galatz. The activity of the Greek post proved unprofitable and the offices had to close down after a short period. Today up to ten covers are believed to exist.

French Post

With the growing interest of West Europe in the region following the Crimean war, France opened offices in Galatz and Braila in November 1857, soon after the inauguration of the French "Danube" shipping line in the Black Sea. The obliterators used were at first of the "Petit Chifres" type ("4008" for Galatz, "4009" for Ibraila), replaced during 1862 by the "Gross Chifres" type ("5085" & "5089" resp.). The "4009" obliterator on cover front presents one of the highest challenges in Romania's postal history and French Levant collecting fields.

The Romanian Post

On 1st April 1869 began its foreign postal service based on a bi-lateral convention with Austro-Hungary that enabled service to third party countries. Special lithographed stamps were issued for this purpose. Several additional issues followed, amongst them an emergency issue caused by the delay in the supply of the typographed issue printed in France due to the Franco-Prussian war. The 50 bani of the emergency issue, used for a few weeks only, is a rarity on cover.

A parallel convention with the North German confederation came into effect on 1st July 1869, but it appears that this route was hardly used, although some of the postal rates were lower than that of the convention with Austria.

Almost every recorded destination is shown. Romanian mail to foreign destinations during this period shows special rates, uncommon destinations and interesting frankings. Romania was a founding member of the GPU (later UPU) and joined on its first day, 1st July 1875.



In Athen 2015, at the palmares night of NOTOS 2015, Eddie wins his first Large Gold medal together with a special prize for this collection. The awards were presented to Eddie by Costas Chazapis, who was the head of the organizing committee.

The Late Bob Stuchell Large Gold Medal Collection

The Bob Stuchell Collections

Ottoman Post in Lebanon | Ottoman Post in the Lost Territories of Europe | Ottoman Post in the Arab Territories | Ottoman Empire Prisoner of War Mail

Robert Wade Stuchell (1936–2025) was a distinguished chemical engineer and a devoted philatelist with a particular passion for the postal history of the Ottoman Empire. He graduated with honors from Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute and earned his Master's degree in Chemical Engineering from New York University. Over the course of his accomplished career, he held key positions at FMC Corporation, Elf Atochem, and CDF Chimie, contributing significantly to the field of industrial chemistry. Bob was a father of three children whom he loved dearly.

Philately was a lifelong passion for Bob, beginning in his teenage years. He initially focused on stamps from the United States, Central America, and South America, but in the 1960s he turned his attention to the postmarks of Ottoman Empire post offices—a field that was scarcely explored in the United States at the time. Over the following decades, Bob assembled exceptional collections of postmarks from the lost territories of the Ottoman Empire, distinguished by their depth, rarity, and historical significance.

His exhibits—Ottoman Post in Lebanon, Ottoman Post in the Lost Territories of Europe, Ottoman Post in the Arab Territories, and Ottoman Empire Prisoner of War Mail—earned top honors at philatelic exhibitions both nationally and internationally. Bob showcased his work at major international shows in

London, Israel, Germany, and Turkey. At his final exhibition in London in 2022, he was awarded a Large Gold medal for Ottoman Post in Lebanon, a collection widely regarded as the finest of its kind.

Beyond these landmark exhibits, Bob also pursued specialized areas such as Missionary Mail in the Near East, American Naval Ship Mail from Turkey, and Postal History of the Steamship Companies within the Ottoman Empire, further reflecting the breadth of his scholarly and collecting interests.

Bob's profound love for Ottoman postal history fostered enduring friendships across continents, connecting him with fellow collectors and scholars around the world. He was deeply admired and respected by all who knew him, both for his generosity of spirit and his unwavering dedication to the field.

From the 1990s onward, Bob played a pivotal role in shaping and promoting Ottoman philately in the United States. He was the founder of the Ottoman and Near East Philatelic Society and served as its founding president until 2023, guiding its growth and fostering a vibrant community of enthusiasts and researchers.

Bob was also a member of several philatelic institutions, including the Royal Philatelic Society London, the American Philatelic Society, the Collectors Club of New York, Oriental Philatelic Association of London, and Society of Israel Philatelists, reflecting his broad engagement with the global philatelic community.

The first Governor was Daoud Pacha who had been the Posts & Telegraphs Director in the capital. The seat of this Government was Deir el Kamar. A local post was started which probably only lasted until the introduction of Turkish postage stamps in late 1862.
