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THE 'KAY GEE VEE' COLLECTION OF THE AUSTRALIA 1914/37 KING GEORGE V ONE PENNY

The humble Australian King George V One Penny stamp, first issued in 1914, is more than just a postage label – it is an icon of Australian philately, and a mirror reflecting the nation's identity during a transformative era. From the outset, the One Penny embodied both imperial loyalty and a budding national pride, replacing the Kangaroo & Map design with the sovereign's profile flanked by native symbols: the kangaroo, emu, and wattle sprigs beneath the crown. Yet what seemed a simple commemorative image evolved into one of the most extensively studied and collected issues in philatelic history.

The One Penny was printed in colossal numbers to serve the needs of a growing nation, yet paradoxically, it became the richest field for specialists. Wartime shortages of ink and paper, constant tinkering with dies, plates, and watermarks, and transitions between printers created an almost endless tapestry of shades, varieties, and anomalies. Plate monograms, imprint settings, subtle shade differences, paper and perforation experiments – each offered collectors fresh discoveries and challenges. Over the decades, patient study and comparison revealed elusive varieties, including unique proofs, rare inverted watermarks, and famous errors that today command international acclaim.

This auction presents The "Kay Gee Vee" Collection – the culmination of a lifetime's devotion by an accomplished philatelist whose work earned an FIP International Gold Medal, and the admiration of judges and peers around the world. Now, as the collector's family wishes to remain anonymous, the collection itself stands as testament to a passion that spanned decades, telling the full story of the One Penny from inception to postal use.

Here, you will find extraordinary rarities: Die Proofs and Plate Proofs illustrating the genesis of the design; a dazzling array of shades reflecting wartime shifts in pigment and supply; rare perforation and watermark combinations that confounded even seasoned experts; and spectacular pieces bearing plate monograms, imprints, and constant varieties, many unique or among a handful known.

This is not merely a stamp collection. It is an encyclopaedia of one of Australia's most beloved issues, it is a narrative of technological evolution, geopolitical symbolism, and the meticulous artistry of stamp production. 





Note: These were prepared by the contractor who manufactured the OS puncturing head. Originally reported in the 1930s, they were used to check the alignment of the perforation pins for the OS equipment. In the 1950s Chief Engineer at Wiggins Teape, Shoalhaven, NSW stated; "It was used solely by the toolroom mechanics, and similar papers are used all over the Western World as part of a standard process, ceasing with the introduction of photogravure and litho printing. Such trial papers used by the tool-shop are always pink."



David did the research on this but unfortunately did not note on the item from where in the National Archives of Australia the original letter is located - it may be in his research papers. I undertook searches of both NAA and Trove and couldn't find the letter, but did find a photo of GT Allen).


• Whilst of significant historical importance, and unique and one of the few pre-proof items or documents relating to the issue in private hands; the condition of the plate layout sheet is quite poor. It has been reinforced at some point in the past with adhesive tape, the tape and/or the adhesive on the tape over time has shrunk causing the paper to gather. The sheet cannot be laid flat for scanning or photography with all of the annotations on it visible, due to the deformation caused by the adhesive tape. There is also significant staining from leaching of the adhesive tape, as well as paper damage at the edge of the adhesive tape reinforcement. The layout sheet could be taken to a professional paper conservator for appraisal and professional restoration.

- Some of the annotations on the sheet are now virtually illegible.
- There is a clear conflict when reconciling the signed indorsement of Harry Nissen and the letter from George Allen Nissen states two lay-out sheets, whereas George Allen states one. Furthermore, there is nothing to confirm that this is the sheet referred to by George Allen. Mind you "This part is to be cut out" is telling. David Terrington believed that the second sheet was destroyed in a fire.
- The layout sheet is not approximate in layout dimensions as per Allen's letter it is very accurate, and it is TO SCALE. The layout is very accurate when measured against the printed stamps in sheets and even against measurements between upper and lower plates when compared to printed sheets showing part imprints or monograms at top. However, it is not marked with overall dimensions or a datum that I would expect an engineering drawing to have. There aren't reference dimensions for the distances of the areas to be cut out for the perforation alignment apparatus, from each other or the top or bottom of the plates, etc. Perhaps it was simply taken to be TO SCALE.
