THE "COWLING" PHILATELIC COLLECTIONS

The "COWLING" Philatelic Collections have their origin some 70 years ago with the son of a refugee family from Guernsey. Our family had just the basics of life but, in a sense, this gave me and my siblings the opportunity to form collections that either had no cost, or very little.

I chose stamp collecting as with this hobby, I 'travelled' the world during a wide range of time periods and experienced many of the great world historical events and animal realms that appear on stamps. Initially my treasured collection was housed in a paperback album from Woolworths. My first stamps came from family and friends and my father's work colleagues. As it became clear this was not a passing fancy, I enrolled with a stamp dealer who would send me an approval book each month. Although my spending rarely exceeded 2s 6d, the dealer still viewed me as a valuable client and even sent me a personal note congratulating me on the previous month's purchases. He may have done this with many of his clients, but it did make me feel important and certainly encouraged more transactions.

In my early teens I was the backbone of our school stamp club. I organised auctions with most stamps estimated at pennies and the sale total rarely exceeding a few pounds. Schooling following the war was a very hit-and-miss affair. There were few printed books distributed, and we had to make our own exercise books for coursework. As I progressed slowly at school it is now obvious that I was and still am profoundly dyslexic and remained the dunce of the class for my entire school life. I did however excel in

technical drawing and transitioned to a technical college. Shortly after joining, a daytrip to Ford's motor company at Dagenham near London took place. This convinced me in short time that I was never going to enjoy engineering. Thus, I took clerical work in central London.

In my lunch breaks I used to visit any one of the plethora of small stamp shops in London – at one time (as I was told) there were over 700 in the London postal districts. Every dealer without exception encouraged me in my collecting. I, of course, visited Stanley Gibbons and on one Saturday morning I went to purchase a 'Crown' album which was fast-bound and printed with spaces for all stamps issued during the reign of King George VI. Who should serve me but none other than A.L. 'Mick' Michael, the owner, who previously owned the venerable stamp dealing house of Wingfields, also in The Strand. He spent an inordinate amount of time with me showing me how to mount stamps correctly and to decide whether to collect mint or used stamps, or both! Elements of his advice have stayed with me for my entire collecting life. Another legend whom I met was W.E. Lea whose emporium was in The Adelphi. He appeared to be a very gruff Mancunian but, like Mick Michael, helped me a lot even though I could never afford anything in his stock. It was Bill Lea who introduced me to Postal History and one of the doyens of what was then a line of collecting that did not have a huge following. Angus Parker had offices in The Strand and it was with some trepidation that I visited him. He was a large robust man with one of the biggest beards I had ever seen. We hit it off from that first meeting when I told him Mr Lea

had sent me to learn all about postal history. Angus was very kind and encouraged my earliest efforts to form a sensible collection – indeed many items in this sale came from Angus, often on the friendliest terms. I had a 'book' with Angus where I entered all my purchases and noted when I managed to pay for each item sometimes many weeks after the purchase had been made.

There were a number of other dealers who showed me equal generosity with discounts and extended payment plans. One of these was the celebrated expert Peter Holcombe who at that time was with J.A.L. Franks in Fetter Lane. Peter introduced me to a breathtakingly wide range of subjects including China and the Far East in general. My interest in Great Britain was nurtured by Martin Willcocks; John Lobo who used to take his summer holidays touring Europe in his beloved Mercedes sports car; Laurie Dilks and Bill Bird who had probably the sharpest minds in stamps and I respected both for their knowledge and kindness.


I enjoyed the auction scene and whilst not a buyer I did purchase or beg copies of the landmark sales catalogues commencing with Nicholas Argenti. Others included Dale-Lichtenstein, Ronnie Hunt, Robert Gibbs' fabulous Rhodesia 'Double Heads' collection, Ron Lea's Great Britain sold as "Maximus" and the Sir Gawaine Baillie sales.

Nearly all my 'stamps' appear in the main Corinphila catalogue and, with my thanks to Corinphila, my Postal History appears in this stand-alone catalogue; so in years to come I will have a memento to look through. Greg Todd has become what will prove to be a lifelong friend whose professionalism speaks volumes and it is Greg who will handle the future sale of collections I have retained namely Guernsey, Herm (my Guernsey grandfather used to take us there as a family during our long summer holidays) and Cornish cancellations – a big mistake as no-one told me how many places there are in Cornwall who had or have their own cancellation - which collection is growing slowly and currently is crammed into 22

Seventy years ago, I had no perception that my collections would eventually appear in such illustrious company at currently the greatest stamp auctioneers in the world. There should be something to interest many collectors or dealers in my sale so please bid generously as the proceeds are going to a good cause!

5062→ Arctic Exploration 1850/51: Balloon Message slip printed on yellow silk (150 x 60 mm.), an unused example made for the Expedition led by Sir John Ross in his search for the ill-fated Sir John Franklin Expedition, which had left London in May 1845 with the ships "Erebus" and "Terror" intending to explore the Canadian Arctic region. They reached Greenland and headed North but were never seen again. Four years later Ross set out in the schooner "Felix" to Lancaster Sound, largely to restore his name after finding the famous North West passage but not recognising he had done so due to ice-blindness (it was later 'found' again by his colleagues on that journey), to search for Franklin and traces of his crew. The Balloon slips were used to attach or be placed inside small balloons, marking where provisions could be found and indicating where the despatching ship intended to spend the winter months when icebound. Ross failed to find Franklin or any of his men and Ross returned to England in October 1851 by way of Greenland, where he encountered rumours that Franklin and his party were all dead. Although most people disregarded these, Ross stood by them. An extraordinary item for the Balloon specialist and the first example this describer has seen. 5063
