BRAZIL CLASSIC STAMPS 1843-1861 THE PABLO REIM COLLECTION (PART II)

Pablo was born in Buenos Aires on 23 June 1955. He is the son of Rosa Etelvina Fraser de Reim and Armando Federico Reim. He also has a sister Karen Alicia Reim. The family's roots are in Stuttgart, Germany.

After graduating from St. George's College in Quilmes (Argentina), Pablo moved to the Universidad Nacional de Buenos Aires where he studied business administration and graduated with two diplomas in Accounting & Business Management. After completing his studies, Pablo commenced his professional career at Valvulas Worcester de Argentina, which is an industrial manufacturer of ball valves. He started as Sales Manager in 1997, and subsequently took over the position as Marketing Director. In 2011 he quit Valvulas Worcester de Argentina and switched to agriculture and cattle breeding.

Pablo met his wife Liliana Palese during student time in Buenos Aires. They married in 1981 and soon their son Federico Guillermo was born in 1983. Today Federico runs the agricultural family businesses in Ayacucho and Santiago del Estero. Federico has four children – Pablo's grandchildren – Faustino, Arturo, Eugenio and Ignacia.

Pablo began collecting stamps at the age 12. His first mentor was his father Armando. A few years later, at age of 16, other hobbies became more important: handball in the German sports club of Quilmes and volleyball in the Quilmes Athletic Club. While Pablo only played these two sports competitively for a few years, tennis has accompanied him throughout life. He has also found great pleasure in skiing.


At a stamp exhibition in Buenos Aires in 1997 Pablo met the well-known Argentine stamp dealer Guillermo Jalil. They discussed philately and it encouraged Pablo to begin collecting stamps again. It was the time when Pablo's son Federico had almost grown up and his professional career was on a stable path. Pablo found more

Today he devotes much of his time to philately, with collector friends and attending stamp exhibitions all over the world.

To quote legendary Robson Lowe

With his achievements, Pablo is a very prominent philatelist and postal historian in the philatelic enterprise. In South American philately he is very important, not least collecting the philatelically important areas and exhibiting accordingly.

Pablo is a Fellow of The Royal Philatelic Society London, an active member of Mi Oficina, the largest and most important philatelic society in South America, and a member of Fundación Bose and AFIPO (Asociación Filatélica Porteña) in Buenos Aires. This year (2024) he was named Academico Correspondiente of the Real Academia Hispanica de Filatelia e Historia Postal and also Academico in the Academia de Historia Postal e Filatelia do Brasil.

Everaldo Santos and Paulo Comelli were his mentors in the Brazilian Philately. He has made many philatelic friends in Brazil, like Walter Klerman Lopez, Reinaldo Macedo, Rogerio Dedivitis, Jose Luis Fevereiro, Jose Alberto Junges and Roberto Assef among many others.

Pablo's collection is developed as a treatment of a Traditional Philately competitive exhibit, comprising the first four issues of Brazil: 1) OLHOS DE BOI i.e. "BULL'S EYES"); 2) INCLINADOS i.e. "GOAT EYES"; 3) VERTICAIS i.e. "VERTICALS"; 4) COLORIDOS i.e. "COLOURED ISSUES". Brazil was the third country in the world, after the United Kingdom and Switzerland, to issue postage stamps. This by itself establishes the importance of this collection! It is not usual to have the opportunity to manage such a collection as this: Pablo Reim's: **Brazil Classic Issues 1843–1861.**





This collection can be summarized with one word Quality, as it proves that Pablo is a connoisseur in philately – i.e. Pablo understands the details, technique, or principles of philately as art and is competent to act as a critical judge in his selections. Pablo has been very selective in his choice of items for this collection, which is proven by those items we have selected to highlight as some of our many "darlings" from Pablo's collection. 


Printing press of the 1843 Bull's Eyes

The letter has been affected by damp but exhibits well and is of great rarity, with just two other covers from Rio being recorded with this franking. Cert. Moorhouse (2013).

Note: Interesting contents for the US Consul "the debate about Texas was going on, but it was generally thought nothing would be done this session of Congress". This turned out be erroneous: as Presidents Tyler and Polk managed to get the joint resolution passed on 1 March 1845, and Texas was admitted into the United States on 29 December 1845.



In 1935, in Porto Alegre, Mr. Clovis Leite invited Mr. Frederico Barata to go to Cachoeira do Sul, where he had mentioned there was a lady from a traditional gaucho family, Silva Goulart, who was believed to own an old archive of family correspondence. The lady showed them an old metal box, full of envelopes dating from 1843 on. Unfortunately, almost all of them had their stamps destroyed, removed without any care, in pieces. The Ambassador Joa Neves da Fontoura, while he was just a boy, had started collecting stamps, and had removed the stamps he needed from the letters in the precious box.

Finally Leite and Barata were able to find a few pieces that were, salvaged from the hands of the future Ambassador. Clovis Leite agreed to give all that was salvaged to Frederico Barata, to be part of his collection. The pieces from Cachoeira do Sul wree then exhibited at the great Exposition Commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the Farrouphilha

Gaucho working in the rural area of Brazil. The letter was kept by a traditional gaucho family as part of their family archive for almost 100 years until its discovery in 1935.

In approximately mid 1950, the collector Amilcar Angelo, living in Sao Paulo, acquired the letter directly from Frederico Barata and kept it for almost 50 years.

In 1997 the "Cachoeira Do Sul Letter" was sold to Orestes Manfro Cruz for the approximate sum of \$ 75,000, Oresto Manfro Cruz was the great Brazilian Champion of Aerophilately, owner of the largest collection of private air transportation stamps ever exhibited in Brazil, and the winner of three FIP Large Gold Medals. He intedned to put together an important collection of Bull's Eyes stamps. However, in 1998 he decided to sell his 'Bull's Eyes' collection, including "Cachoeira Do Sul Letter". The amount of this sale reached \$ 250,000, the "Cachoeira do Sul Letter" was said to be included for the amount of \$100,000. The buyer of the collection was a collector from Rio de Janeiro, Roberto Seabra Benevides.

After remaining in Brazilian hands for over a century, "Cachoeira do Sul Letter" left Brazil in 2002 for the first tie, when Luis Alemany Indarte acquired the rarities from the Benevides collection.

History

1 - According to Everaldo Nigro dos Santos, the present owner, this piece was seen for the first time at BRAPEX 1985, in Belo Horizonte, Minas Gerais, in the hands of its owner, Mr. Saturnino, a philatelist and businessman of the steel sector, acquaintance of Paulo R. Comelli. Mr. Saturnino went to BRAPEX with the purpose of selling this piece. It was offered to several dealers present at the exhibition, who apparently did not realize the rarity of the piece they were being offered. He asked then Paulo Comelli to help him to identify collectors of Numerals of the Empire possibly present at the exhibition. Paulo introduced him to Angelo Lima. The piece was then offered to Angelo Lima for the price of US\$5.000, proposal in principle accepted and to be confirmed the next day after assuring the authenticity of the piece in São Paulo. Angelo Lima planned to submit the piece for examination by an expert next day, in São Paulo and once the authenticity was confirmed, close the business. On the following day, already decided to buy the piece, Angelo Lima showed the specimen to the specialist Sant'Anna who was delighted with the discovery. It is said that, on the second day, Sant'Anna, commented to his friend Alfredo Abōes, a philatelic dealer now deceased:

- "I did not sleep last night. I am beside myself with joy ever since yesterday when Lima showed me the greatest discovery in Brazilian Philately over the last 50 years. The greatest postal rarity of the Empire of Brazil has appeared in Belo Horizonte". It is a large piece of a package, with 3\$700 réis multiple and composed postage, bearing a 600 réis Slanted Numeral block of 4, a 90 réis Goat's Eye vertical strip of 3 and another vertical strip of 3 of 10 réis. The stamps are cancelled by 4 strikes of cancellation mark "Correio Geral da Corte" of type P.A. 1609, however with a sole 3 cm diameter, dated December 20th, 1853. This is one of two multiples, so far recorded, with a mix of Slanted Numeral and Goat's Eye. The total amount of each set is hand-written next to them and on the left side of the piece, also hand-written, is the total amount of the postage, of 2\$700 réis plus 1\$000 réis insurance premium and the respective grand total of 3\$700. Still according to Everaldo, the Post Office agent, the author of the postage calculation notes, was named Menezes Pacheco. The piece is considered within the category of carta "Segura" (insured letter), thus denominated the correspondence and packages mailed with insurance cover. The premium of 1\$000 corresponded to an insured value of 50\$000, value fixed as per Articles 84 to 86 of Decree (without number), of March 5th, 1829 e Article 203 of Decree 399 of December 21st, 1844.

This piece acquired from its second known owner, has got the name "The Letter of Minas Gerais", according to the interview with Angelo Lima for the magazine "Mosaico" no. 5, of the Câmara Brasileira de Filatelia, issued in July, 1992. Although being also the owner of the famous "Pack Strip" (the Bull Eyes vertical strip of 30+30+60 réis), Angelo Lima considered this piece as the favourite of his collection. As part of Everaldo Nigro dos Santos' collection, it was displayed at the AMPHILEX, held in the Waldorf Astoria, in New York, in November 1996.
